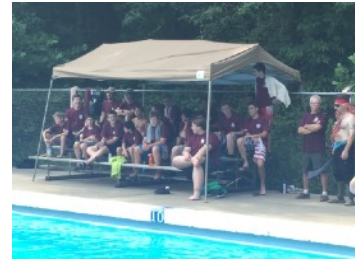

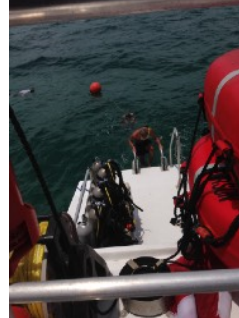

In Memoriam

Charles Chip Lewis

Troop 78 has lost another kingpin. Charles L. Lewis Jr, known by all as Chip, passed away on May 11, 2017. Chip became active in the Troop when his son Matt began his journey to Eagle. As so often happens, once one gets into 78 they stay. Luckily for us, Chip did stay. With the formation of Friends of 78, Inc, in 1999, Chip stepped up to be the Treasurer. And for the next 18 years, he guided the financial side, from budget to disbursements to asset allocation, always with skill and precision, and often humor. Once, when we struggled with how to fund the replacement of a dilapidated lawn tractor, Chip found a solution: "If the new tractor is yellow, we can use the Bus Fund". Our prayers and thoughts go out to Chip's wife Diane, and his children Matt and Carolyn. Chip was a valuable asset to Troop 78, and he will be missed.

In Memoriam

Albert D'Antonio

Al D'Antonio, known to many 78'ers as "Big Al" passed away on Monday, May 1st. He was 95 years old. Al lived by the Scout Oath and Law, always putting God, Country, and others first. He was a Committee Member and supporter of Troop 78 and the Chester County Boy Scouts for more than 50 years, a Vigil Honor member of Octoraro Lodge 22 and recipient of the Troop's Bellegrau and Old Loon awards for distinguished service to Troop 78. Al was very active in troop fundraising events, especially the driveway sealing crew, the hoagie sales, and at Radnor Races, helping to set up before race day, as cashier of food sales, and manning the "will call" ticket window in his later years. Al was an active member of the Order of the Arrow exemplifying cheerful service through his service to Camp Horseshoe. He worked for many years at the Order of the Arrow weekends and on special projects at Camp Horseshoe, including clearing the trees for the "new" camp road in the 1980's and was an integral part of the renovation of the "Lane House" driving down to camp almost every Saturday for a year. He also worked many hours during 2001 and 2002 helping to build the current troop cabin.

Al was a Boy Scout, joining Wayne Troop 1 at age 15, participating in their drum and bugle corps and reaching the rank of Life. He was a WWII veteran serving in Europe during 1944 and 45 with the Army 102 D Infantry Division, and was among those veterans interviewed by then Eagle Scout candidate Michael Bennett, for inclusion of their military experiences in the Library of Congress. He is survived by four sons, three of whom were or are members of Troop 78 (Steve, Rob and Mike). He was the proud father of two Eagle Scouts, Steve and Mike, and the even prouder grandfather of three Eagle Scouts Greg, Brett, and Bobby.

Although his presence will be missed, he exemplified the ideals of scouting by leaving a place better than he found them through his service to the Troop, Camp Horseshoe, and the community.
