"Do Not Move US Embassy to Jerusalem"



UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS

Secretary of State Rex Tillerson was asked by Bishop Cantú, a member of the Bishops' Committee recently returned from a visit to Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza, not to move the American Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. Excerpts from the Bishops' letter to the Secretary of State follow:

"USCCB has long supported a two-state solution, a "secure and recognized Israel living in peace alongside a viable and independent Palestinian state." For this reason, we implore you to maintain the U.S. embassy in Tel-Aviv. Relocating the embassy to Jerusalem is tantamount to recognizing Jerusalem as the undivided capital of Israel. In fact, decades ago, the international community determined that the status of Jerusalem is to be decided in negotiations as mutually agreed by Israel and Palestine. Moving the embassy to Jerusalem would erode the U.S. commitment to a two-state solution, and is a threat to pursuing peace and ending conflict....As Pope Francis declares, 'the two-state solution must become a reality and not merely a dream.' The Holy See's recent recognition of the State of Palestine promotes a two-state solution in which Jerusalem is, in the words of Pope Francis, "preserved as the capital of the three religions, as a point of reference, as a city of peace." (Quote from Bishop Oscar Cantú, Chairman, Committee on International Justice and Peace of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops)

Possible Change of Mass Times Being Discerned



Last weekend parishioners were asked to pray for guidance by the Holy Spirit for a proposed Mass schedule change designed to raise our total Mass attendance. This week all are asked to continue to pray for this but complement it by informing themselves of such facts as (1) the numerical pattern of attendance at each of our three Masses from last August through last weekend (consult insert graph) (2) the chronic challenge to find liturgical ministers for the 5 PM Mass (3) we have two Masses in English and one in Spanish (4) a number of our Hispanic families cannot make the early Sunday Mass and of those who do, 1/4 to 1/3 regularly arrive late, (5) we have one priest so adding a Mass is ill-advised. As stated last weekend, we wish to expand the opportunities for attending a weekend Mass mainly, not exclusively, for many of our working Hispanic parishioners. Based on over two years of observing the mediocre attendance at our Spanish Mass on Sunday morning as well as the high numbers of late arrivals to it every week, our pastor has begun a process of discernment to find a more ac-

commadating weekend Mass schedule for all but for them especially. This process began formally at our recent monthly Pastoral Council meeting and continued with the Hispanic leadership group that meets on Thursday evenings. Unofficially, the pastor has been discussing this possibility for over two years with Hispanic parishioners and feels the time is now for its earnest, prayerful discernment by all parishioners. Parishioners' input is welcomed and they will soon be provided an opportunity for this in a survey insert in our weekly bulletin.

Time wise: note from the chart above there is but an hour change on both days, from 5PM to 6PM on Saturday, and on Sunday from 8:30 to 9:30 (Spanish Mass), 10:30 to 11:30 (English Mass).

Language wise: note the Saturday eve Mass will be bilingual, thus providing the working Spanish speaking the opportunity to attend a Saturday eve Mass. Our bilingual Hispanic youth also like this option so as to attend it from time to time.

Do trong 2 năm quan sát, số người tham dự bình thường trong Thánh Lễ đều vào sáng Chủ Nhật cũng như số lượng cao khách đến trễ trong mỗi tuần. Vì vậy, Linh mục của chúng ta đã bắt đầu một quá trình nhận định để tìm ra một lịch trình Thánh Lễ thích hợp cho tất cả chúng ta. Quá trình này đã bắt đầu chính thức tại cuộc họp Hội Đồng Mục Vụ gần đây của chúng tôi và với nhóm đại diện giáo dân Tây Ban Nha vào các buổi tối thứ năm.



Một cách không chính thức, Linh mục của chúng ta đã thảo luận khả năng này với giáo dân gốc Tây Ban Nha trong 2 năm. Và cảm thấy thời gian bây giờ là nghiêm túc, sáng suốt để cầu nguyện cho tất cả các giáo dân. Mọi giáo dân tham dự đều được chào đón và họ sẽ sớm được cung cấp cơ hội cho điều này trong một cuộc khảo sát bản tin vào cuối tuần.

Để đề nói, cho đến bây giờ tất cả chúng ta hãy cầu nguyện để được hướng dẫn bởi Chúa Thánh Thần cho các đề xuất thay đổi lịch trình Thánh Lễ sau đây nhằm cải thiện Thánh Lễ cho tất cả chúng ta.
