6. Write first/2nd draft of Self-Introduction essay. You can use the mindmap worksheet or self-introduction sample sentence to prompt your writing.

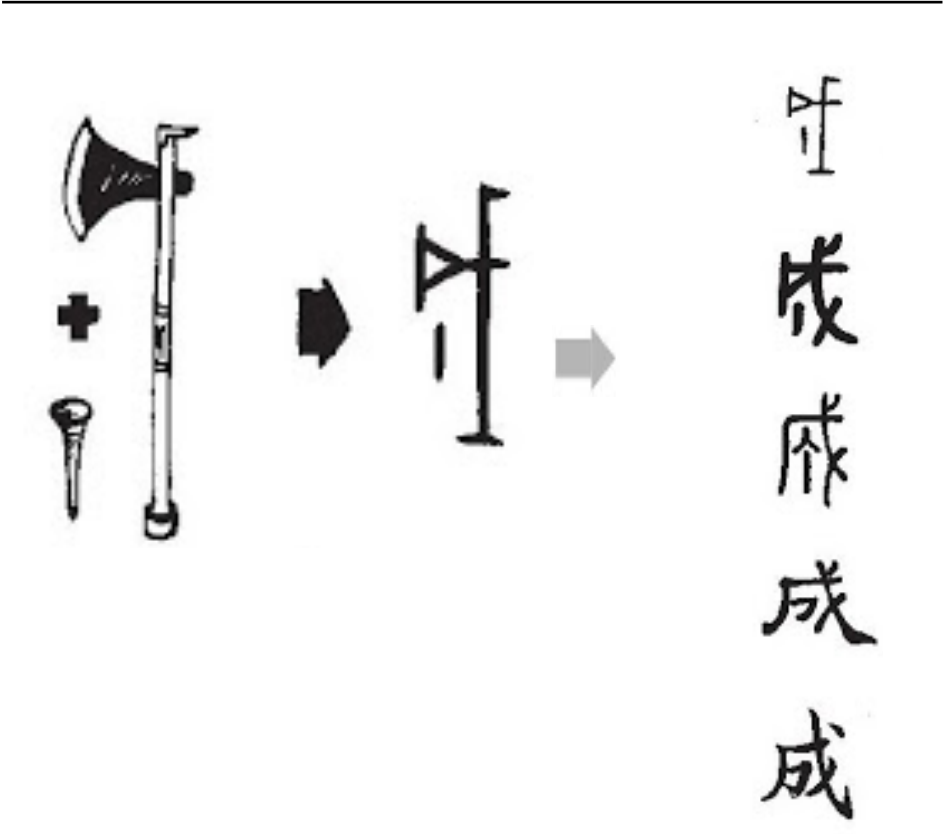

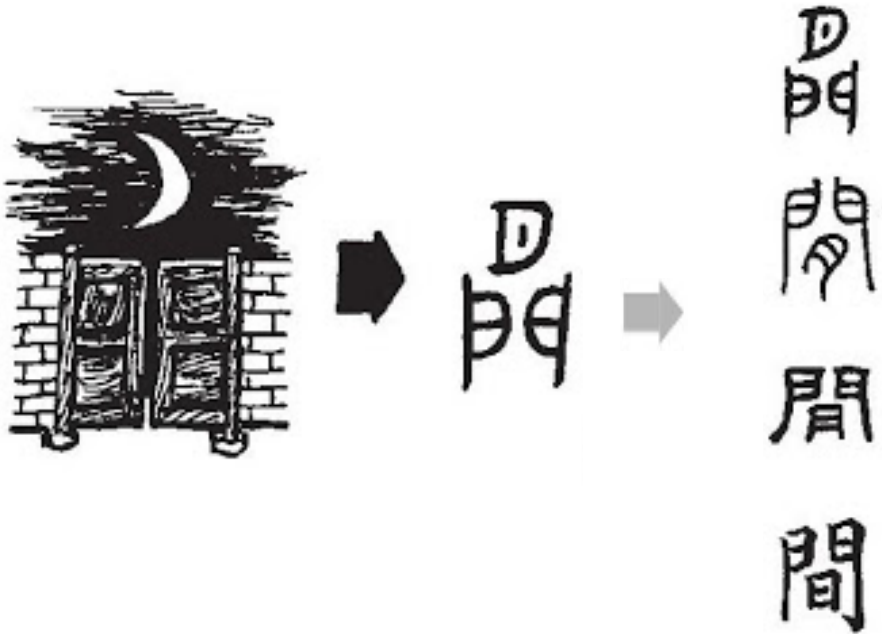

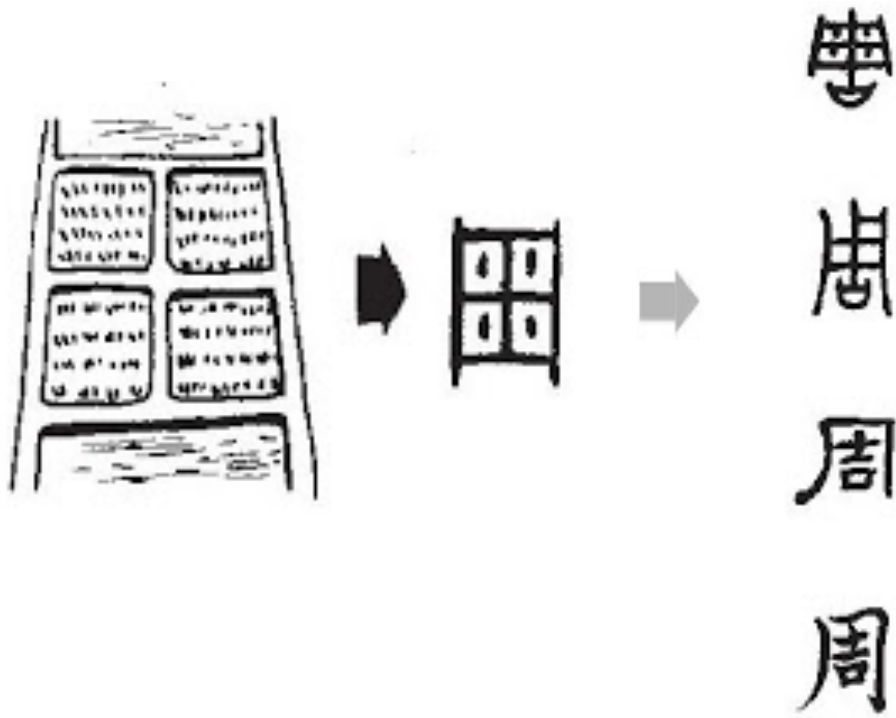


Associative Compound: seeing the moon from the gap between the doors.

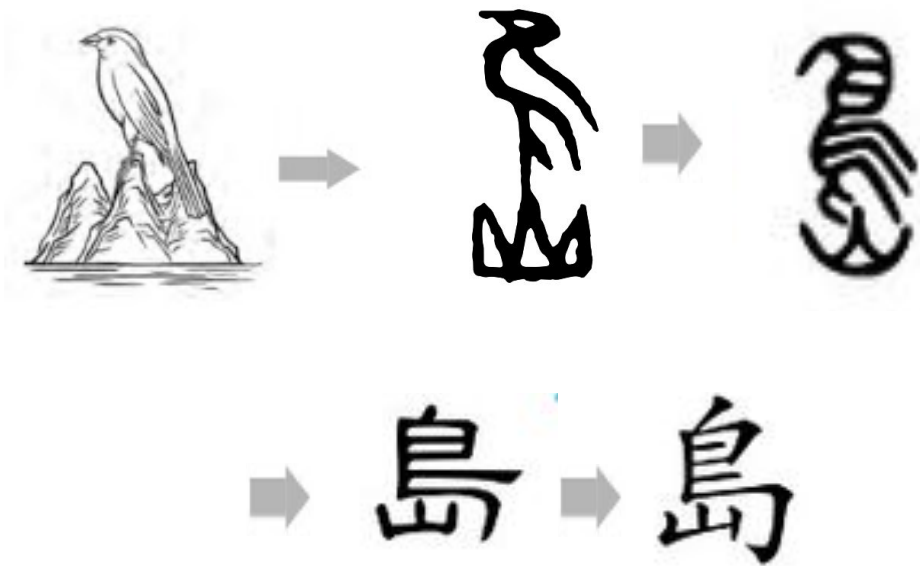


Associative Compound: crop land with crop plants all over it, and boundaries around it.

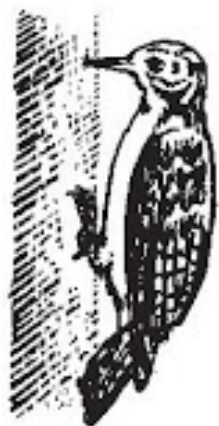


Associative Compound: a piece of subcontinental land that is surrounded by water, with birds resting on it.

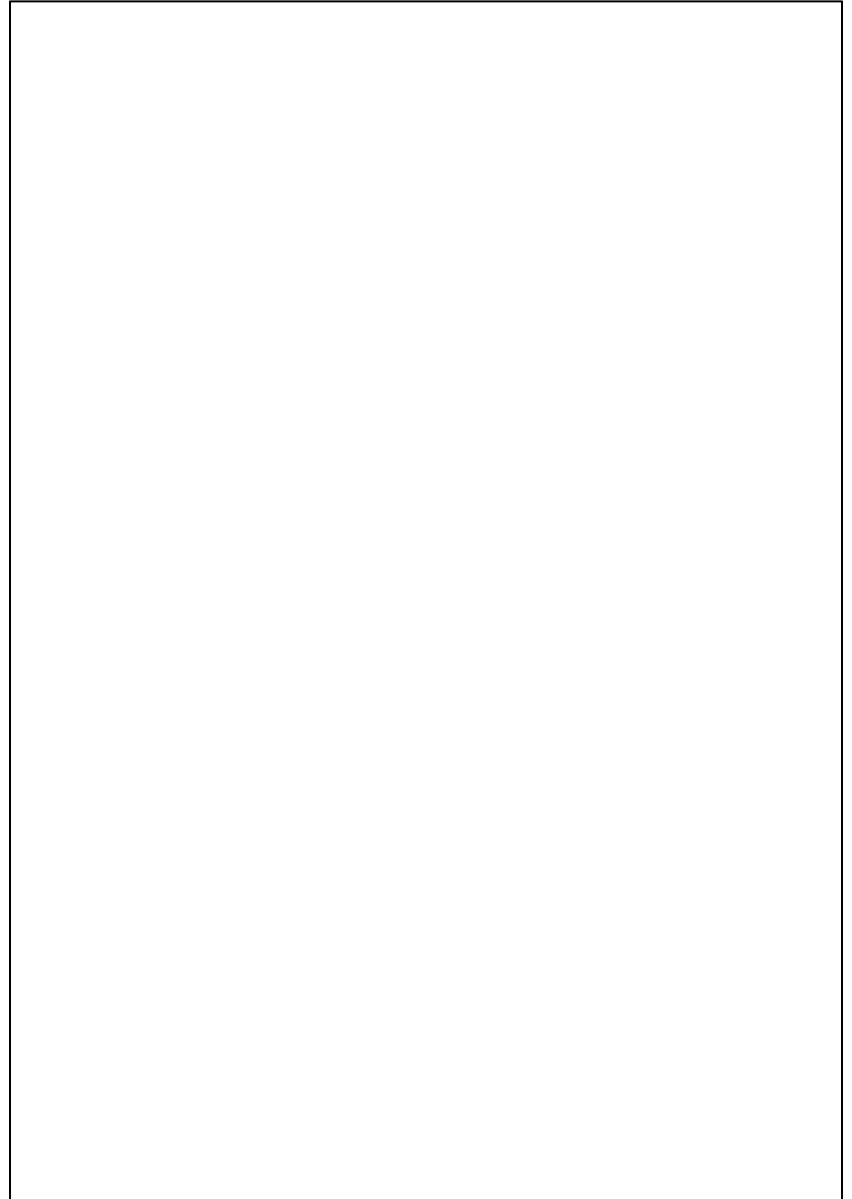

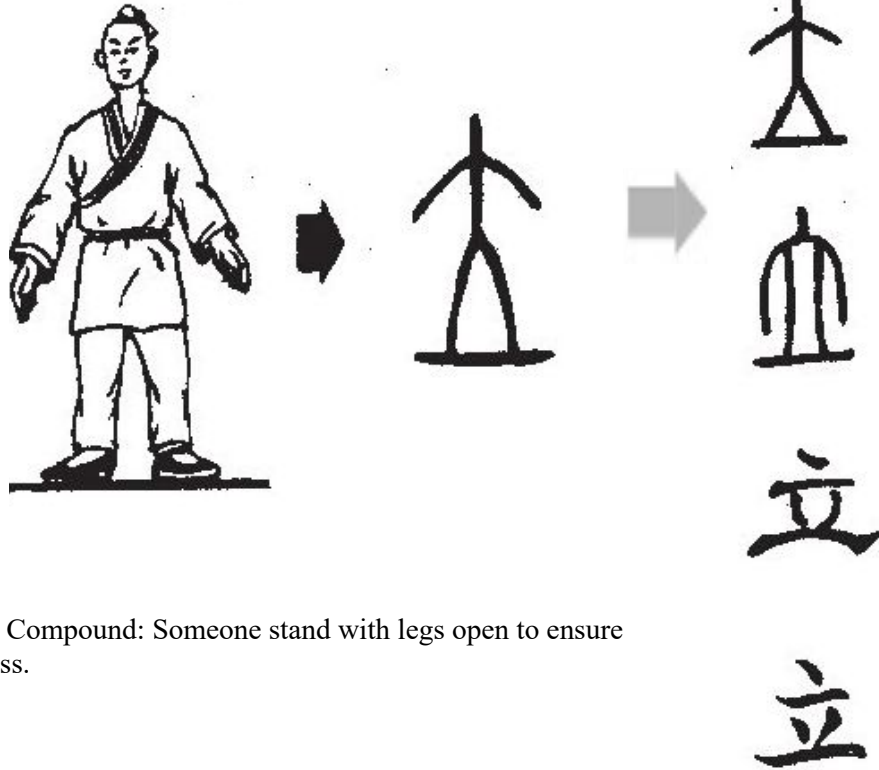


Pictogram word: deer with beautiful fur, a pair of antelers and eyes

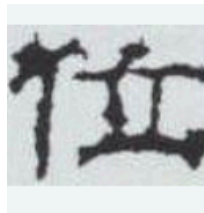
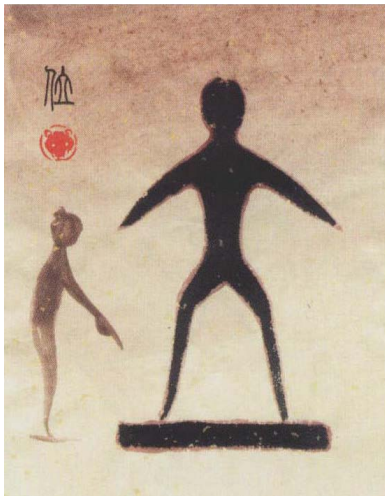
