Pastor's Study
Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Matthew 3:13-17

"You first" "Oh, no you go ahead" "No. I insist." Okay! How many times have we seen this happen at a door going into a restaurant. It's a 'door dance' as people rush to grab the door handle to usher in the person coming up behind them! Usually it creates a jam, as people try to outdo one another with courtesy wishing that the other person steps through ahead of them! (Sometimes we see this 'back-and-forth' again at the table after the waiter sets the bill on the table, when good friends fight over who gets to pay the bill! – I used to call it the '*ticket arm-wrestle*' as different hands grab the bill demanding to kindly pick up the tab!) Usually it ends with an "Okay, I'll pick up the next one", which does help ensure friends keep in touch by committing to make sure there is a 'next-time' to meet up again soon.

I think this is what we are seeing in today's gospel. Jesus presents himself for baptism to John the Baptist. Yet, John hesitates, out of inferiority, and insists that Jesus be the one to 'baptize him'. A little family note: John says here, "I need to be baptized by you, and *yet you are coming to me?*" (Matt 3:14). Like mother like son, because doesn't John sound a lot like Elizabeth, when she said to Mary, as Mary visited to help Elizabeth during her pregnancy in Luke 1:43, "*How does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?*" Elizabeth taught little John well – conveying good manners and good faith to John! John knows his lowly place, (John always has, recall when he said, "I must decrease and He increase"-Jn 3:3)

We can marvel, at Jesus humbly presenting himself as a student-disciple under John here. But, this is not new in Jesus's life thus far. Jesus has been making such humble acts, all his life. Recall that Jesus sat at the feet of the teachers in the Temple (when he was 'lost and found' by Mary/Jospeh Luke 2:46-47). Jesus easily could have taught them a thing or two-million. Even with regard to his own parents there too. He humbly submits obediently to them after the Temple teaching episode and leave Jerusalem, returning with them to Nazareth (*He had made the case that he could work and survive the big city Jerusalem even at 12 years old-Luke 2:51 says "He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them"*) His whole life was a humbling 'going down' to serve and save humanity. This is exactly what Philippians 2:5-11 tells us, of Jesus' downward social mobility in ministry--*Jesus empties himself to fill us!* In addition to Jesus revealing his humility through all of these acts, He also was upholding the good of social order – maintaining religious customs as having their own purpose, too. Luke's gospel emphasizes the place of good custom and rituals to keep order in life, such as when Mary/Joseph performed the customs of circumcision, purification and Temple Offering/ Presentation in Luke 2:21-24. Luke tells us that is was to "perform the custom of the law" (2:27). On another level too, Jesus is upholding an expected protocol, because He was approving/giving legitimacy to John's preparatory work, while also now superseding it by initiating his own ministry as fulfillment of John's. Matthew emphasizes this 'fulfilling' function.

In Matt 3:15, Jesus says to John in reply, "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." In Jesus' major inaugural teaching, of the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5-7), He will announce, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. *I have come* not to abolish but to fulfill" (5:17). By Jesus fulfilling the law, he was both observing it fully, yet also revealing its purpose/ intent. He was filling it full with life/meaning. He was announcing, "This is how we do it". Not as a dead letter to slavishly follow, but as a life-giving spirit to share!

Of course, through all of His works and words Jesus will continue to balance this 'love of God' & 'Love of Neighbor'-- Matt 22:40 "*The whole law and the prophets hang on these two commandments.*" Jesus embodies this interpretation Himself, as he expresses through all of his fulfilling ministry both the vertical love of God & the horizontal love of Neighbor in everything. In Matthew 23:23, where Jesus expose the hypocrisy of the Pharisees, He emphasizes upholding both the letter and spirit in the Law/Custom's observance. He says there, "these you should have done {proper tithe customs}, without neglecting the others {mercy, fidelity}." And we are called to follow Him! Keep the Law, yet keep it with Love – keep the Love in the Law!

A little note: some people are troubled by the question raised in this reading: "Why does Jesus need baptism-He is Purity itself?" Yes, He is. And so, He does this, not FOR Himself, but FOR US. To show us (Baptism is not an empty ritual – It gives grace in addition to cultivating humility!) It changes us. Baptismal water does not make Jesus, it makes US like Jesus – gives us His grace! I like how St Maximus of Turin (*lived 380 – c. 465*) summarizes it: "Someone might ask, "Why would a holy man desire baptism?" Listen to the answer: Christ is baptized, not to be made holy by the water, but to make the water holy, and by his cleansing to purify the waters which he touched" (Sermo 100, De Sancta Epiphania 1,3).
