ECE Shared Resources is the only platform that provides a systems approach to address these challenges while strengthening the needs of this sector. Further, the pragmatic tools and resources enable practitioners to improve the quality of the education and care they provide while streamlining the reach of technical assistance and coaching specialists; this in turn helps states 'take quality to scale' in a cost-effective manner.

Are there savings or discounts offered?

Pre-negotiated everyday discounts are available on a variety of products and services used by early childhood education and care programs throughout the US. Membership

Participation is by membership. Every provider will be given a free year of membership from their first login during 2019 with unlimited users. After the first year, membership fees are as follows:

Family Child Care Homes - \$35/year with 2 user logins.

Child Care Centers with a licensed capacity of 99 or fewer - \$110/year with 4 user logins. Child Care Centers with a licensed capacity of 100 or more - \$150/year with 6 user logins.

For every user beyond the number provided, there will be a \$10 fee. As an example, your center is licensed for 65 children and you begin using the system on March 31, 2019. You will have unlimited user through March 31, 2020. On April 1, 2020 you will pay \$110 for 4 users to have access to the system. Each additional user will cost you \$10.

Eco Hot Tip: Radon

Radon is the largest cause of lung cancer in non-smokers.

RADON

January is national radon action month. Radon is a serious health risk facing tens of thousands of U.S residents. Exposure to radon gas causes 20,000+ deaths annually. The challenge is that we can't see or smell radon, so it's easy to forget that this toxic gas may be a concern in any home or child care.

Radon is an invisible radioactive gas that can only be detected through testing. It is produced by the natural breakdown of uranium in rock, soil, and water. Any building can have a radon problem. Radon gets into a building by moving up through the ground and then through cracks and holes in the foundation. Buildings can trap radon, which can lead to harmful concentrations indoors.

REDUCE YOUR EXPOSURE

The Environmental Protection Agency recommends that all homes, child cares and schools be tested. If your average indoor radon level measures at or above 4 pCi/L, take action to reduce it.

Fixing buildings to reduce radon exposure may entail sealing cracks in the foundation, ventilating the area or depressurizing the soil.

HOW TO TEST FOR RADON

Test kits are available at larger home improvement stores. They typically cost about \$15. Test kits also can be ordered from online retailers, as well as from the National Radon Program Services. Visit sosradon.org or call 1-800-SOS-RADON.
