Thief in the Night

Now a word was brought to me stealthily and my ear received a whisper of it ... disquieting thoughts from visions of the night when deep sleep falls on man. Job 4:12-14

He came again last night, singing his whispering songs, filling my mind with should-have's, what-ifs, not-enoughness, fears about my future, John's future, my family's future, etc.

Stealthily circling my bedroom while stealing my sleep and my peace, he curled his dark hand around my brain with his fingers of half-lies and lies!
