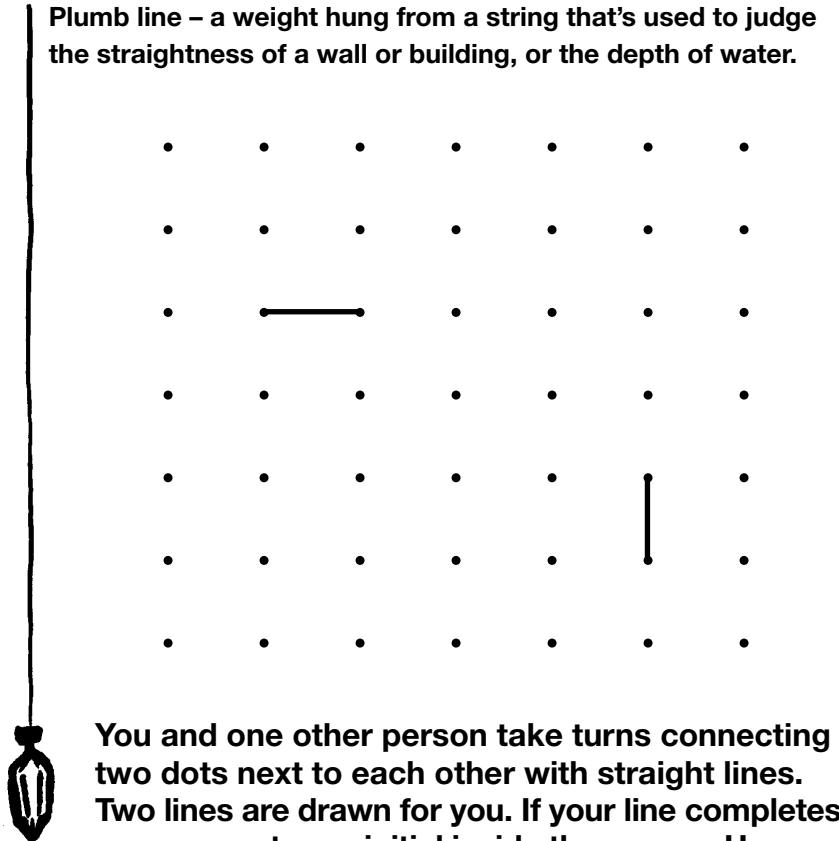


## gather

**Plumb line – a weight hung from a string that’s used to judge the straightness of a wall or building, or the depth of water.**

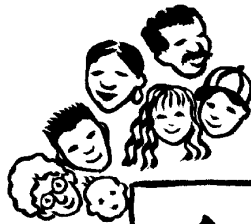
