John Lucas – TAW August 1 Demonstrator



Five years ago I retired as a photographer for Tenn. Tech University where I worked for 26 years. I have been working in wood for about 35 years as a hobby. I think I have always had a creative side from singing and playing guitar as well as photography and woodworking. It is all starting to come together to let me create unique works of art. I have this constant awareness of things around me that give me ideas to work from. I think that stems from photography and learning to really “see” the simply things around us. That and the sense of humor I get from my Dad allow me to constantly play with ideas.

After I moved to Cookeville and met the wonderful people at the Appalachian Center for craft I began to work more as a wood turner and carver. This led to many explorations of what is capable with a wood turning lathe. Most of my pieces today either start or end on the lathe but I try not to limit myself. If I have a design in mind I use whatever tool it takes to create the piece. Working with the Craft Center also allowed me to learn some metal working which has proven quite useful to augment my woodworking

Along with working in wood I like to help others learn these skills. I have written many articles for American Woodturner, Woodturning Design, More Woodturning, Woodturning fundamentals, and the English publication Woodturning. I have also taught classes at Arrowmont, John C Campbell Folk School and the Appalachian Center for Crafts. I travel around the country doing demonstratons at wood turning clubs and have demonstrated at several regional and national woodturning symposiums.

Tool making demo

In this demo I will show many different tools that I’ve made and will demonstrate how to shape and heat treat smaller steel tools. I will make a small hollowing tool. I will also describe how to make HSS cutting tips. If time allows I will turn a tool handle and show how to insert the new blade.

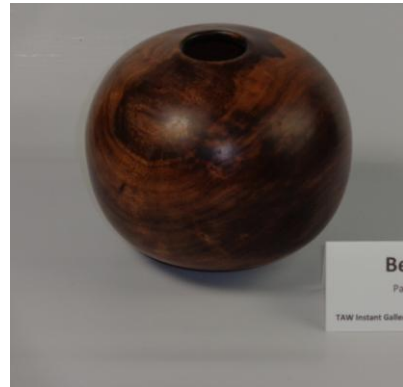

TOOL CADDY

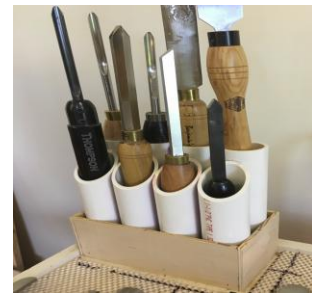
Interested in a simple project to help you get better organized in your shop? Recently, I made this small tool caddy to help me better organize some of my turning gouges. It's made with 1 1/2" standard pvc pipe.

The big question for me at the beginning of the project was how best to glue the individual pieces of pvc pipe together. Since I didn't know for sure, I tested three different glues. I tested Titebond CA glue, J-B Weld 2 part epoxy, & Oatey's Clear PVC Cement and Purple Primer. The PVC Cement and Purple Primer is the standard pvc glue you may have seen plumbers or guys who put in irrigation water lines use.

Of the three glues I tested, the CA glue was the worst. It broke apart easily with very little pressure. The two part epoxy and the standard pvc glue (PVC Cement & purple primer) were comparable to each other and I concluded either one would meet my needs. I chose to use the standard pvc glue for my project.

Each piece of pvc pipe in my tool caddy is 8" long. The tops of the four pieces in the front row are cut at a 45 degree angle.

The four pieces in the back row sit on a 3/4" piece of plywood to give them some 'lift' and make it easier to access the tools in the back row. The entire tool caddy sits atop a piece of 3/4" plywood. After I glued the pvc pipes together, I wrapped the bottom few inches of the caddy with 3/16" plywood to add a little more stability.



It's a simple little project and can be used to help organize and store a variety of handled tools, paint brushes, dowelling, etc.
