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So, Christians are to be in the world but not of the world. This is the message of Jesus when praying for His disciples: "They (disciples) do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world" (Jn.17:16). What the world offers is contrary to what Jesus proclaims. The apostles knew that the world was corrupt due to sin and evil. St. Paul also told the Philippians that they were surrounded by "a deceitful and underhand brood", so they should shine among them like stars in the world (Phil.2:15-16).

Is our generation also as corrupt as at the time of the apostles? Why is this generation corrupt? The world of today does not want God to rule it. Indirectly, it has pledged allegiance to the evil one. The statutes of God are trampled upon with impunity. People love money, pleasure, wealth, riches, fame and power more than anything else. True love of God and neighbor is gone. Everyone is suspicious of the other person. There is little discipline and self-control. Individualism has overshadowed community life. Human life is no longer important and so people take delight in crime. Even though God created everything to be good, including human beings, it seems as if whatever He created is not good enough now. Are we trying to be like those who tried to build the Tower of Babel?

Do I want to save myself from this generation which is corrupt? Fear of being left out is one of the things making it difficult to let Jesus be my Shepherd. The message of the Gospel has been distorted so I have been deceived to believe false and fake messages. Another problem is that I do not want to commit myself to be a faithful Catholic. I just want people to know that I belong to the group.

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
