

# 2021 Jarosch Cup




## The Jarosch Cup - Cheese Lofting event general guidelines.

- 1) The Jarosch Cup is a traveling trophy, in honor and remembrance of Fred Jarosch, beloved long-time WOOSH member and avid rocketeer.
- 2) A rocketry contest will be held annually at the WOOSH (ECOF) Eat Cheese or Fly launch in August, to determine who will hold the Jarosch Cup for the following year.
- 3) The holder of the Cup shall be responsible for planning and hosting the contest for the following year.

## 2021 Jarosch Cup Rules

The 2021 Jarosch Cup contest is a spot landing competition with the objective of safely landing Cheddar or rocket with Cheddar payload on the Moon. The target will be a 5' diameter inflatable plastic moon located within 200 feet of the low powered launch pads.

- There is no limit to the number of Moon Landing attempts that can be made by an individual contestant.
- Rockets may use any motor up to and including F class.
- The Cheddar payload will be a 1-ounce cheddar cube (provided by contest director).
- Any Cheddar which is released or ejected from the rocket must utilize a parachute or streamer which is clearly marked with the contestant's name.
- To ensure the safe recovery and fair judgement of all contest flights, contestants must notify the contest director at the contest registration table prior to launch. The attempt must be noted on the flight card and announced by the LCO.
- This event will be held on Saturday with Sunday reserved as a weather backup day.



## Winning the contest

- 1) Any Cheddar or Cheddar payload section stuck directly on the Moon wins. **GAME OVER!**
- 2) Any Cheddar or rocket with Cheddar payload landing within 100' of the moon will be measured from the Cheddar to the closest point of the Moon. The winner will be the contestant with the shortest measured distance of Cheddar to the Moon.

## Flight Disqualifications

- 1) Arguing with judges regarding rules and/or decisions
- 2) Impact or core sampling that damages the moon.
