From time to time political discussions and church teachings become intermeshed to the point they require comment. Most of you know that I try to stay out of the political arena when speaking from the pulpit or when sending official church communication like church newsletters, but I have been asked recently about my feelings on the pause of USAID dollars to other countries. Here is my response:

In truth I do not know enough about USAID to offer a definitive opinion, but according to their mission statement USAID's mission is: "We partner to end extreme poverty and promote resilient, democratic societies while advancing our security and prosperity." Ending extreme poverty is a good thing! I remember reading something in the scriptures about caring for the most vulnerable in society, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, caring for the widow and orphan, giving alms, and generally lifting up those ravished by famine, war, or drought. I do not know anyone who believe that poverty is a good thing, whether it is within our borders or abroad. That said I don't know if the agency was accomplishing this mission. I don't know if there was waste, fraud, or abuse, I simply do not have the ability to fully research or understand a multibillion-dollar agency to evaluate its effectiveness in caring for the most vulnerable peoples of the earth. I believe America is big enough and wealthy enough that we can help peoples around the world. I believe we can and should be a generous nation, but I do not know enough about USAID. Probably USAID accomplished good and bad things. And so in truth, I cannot speak intelligently on this political debate except to say that caring for those experiencing poverty is a good thing and we should do more of it.

Which brings me to the conclusion I have arrived at. I can find no where in the scriptures where it says, "give unto Caesar so that Caesar can feed the hungry"; I do however remember Jesus' words to the disciples, "you feed them" (Mark 6:37).

I remember Jesus saying to the chosen sheep "when I was naked you clothed me…just as you did to the least of these who are members of my family you did it to me" (Matthew 25:36-40)

It is certainly possible that the lives of children and others will be worsened by the decision of our government to pause USAID spending, and if that is the case it is sad and tragic. But as Christians we cannot and should not wait for our government or any government when it comes to helping those who are in need. Whether it is a family up the street living on welfare or a mom and her children fleeing from Ukraine, or a man starving because crops didn't grow in Nigeria, or South Sudan, or Somalia; we are called to feed them, to clothe them, to heal those who are sick, visit those who are lonely, care for and love them. This is our job, our calling, this is what Jesus told us to do and we should do it, alongside every other Christian whose faith teaches the importance of caring for the vulnerable and downtrodden. I know it is a daunting task. How can small churches across the US possibly feed the 30 million people living in famine areas today or the roughly 700 million people who experience hunger regularly in the world?

We do it by remembering that we are not alone. By remembering that Christ is with us! The same Christ who fed thousands with a few loaves of bread and two fish; and we have a lot more to offer than that little boy's lunch. We must set to work, do what we can, love our neighbors here and abroad and work for the well-being of all people. Perhaps this is an opportunity for the church to rise to the occasion and for Christ to work. Perhaps this is a chance for us to fulfill our calling, and truly be the global church that Christ intended for us to be! As Jesus said, "You feed them"! I pray tonight that hunger would cease, that poverty would be eradicated, and that Christ would be glorified through it all! It's time to work, time to serve, time to share, and time to love! It is time to feed Christ's sheep! In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holv Spirit. Amen.
