Behind the Song: “On Eagle’s Wings”

The music for the hymn “On Eagle’s Wings” was written by Father Jan Michael Joncas in 1976 after returning from a meal with his friend Doug Hall, when he discovered Hall’s father had died of a heart attack. To console his friend, Father Joncas recalled “I knew this was a hard, hard experience in anybody’s life, and I just wanted to create something that would be both prayerful and comforting.” Returning to his parents’ Minnesota home, he composed the music on his guitar. “On Eagle’s Wings” was recorded and published in 1979.



Born Dec. 21, 1951, Father Joncas studied at the University of St. Thomas in Minneapolis, Notre Dame, and at the Pontifical Liturgical Institute in Rome.

Ordained 1980, he taught at both St. Thomas and Notre Dame. He has composed over 20 collections of liturgical music. While serving in Minnesota he collaborated with Marty Haugen and David Hass, both of whose music we sing frequently at First Lutheran Church.

Following the 1995 bombing of the Federal Building in Oklahoma City, Father Joncas received a request for the hymn to be played by the then governor’s wife, Cathy Keating.

To his surprise and delight an Italian version was sung at the funeral of famed operatic tenor Luciano Pavarotti.

The hymn was also used in Joe Biden’s acceptance speech in 2020, and at the 2015 funeral of his son Beau Biden.

The hymn is frequently sung at the U.S. Air Force Academy Cadet Chapel, and in Catholic, mainline Protestant, charismatic, and other denominations at baptisms, weddings, and funerals.

It was also used during Pope John Paul II’s various visits to the United States in 1980s.

Father Michael Joncas: “Scripture grounds my life as a Christian, a preacher and a priest.”
