Wildfires

Most of you know I was born in Los Angeles. I grew up there, went to church there, graduated high school there, learned to surf, bowl, water ski, play volleyball, soccer, softball and disc golf in and around the City of Angels. I rode my bike from Palos Verdes to Malibu, from La Crescenta to the top of Mt. Wilson (where the TV station antennas reside), and of course, from my house to the beach numerous times.

I met my beloved there and together we lived within and throughout the Greater Los Angeles area, going to Dodger Stadium, dining in Malibu, enjoying the Griffith Park Observatory, visiting the Getty and Norton Simon museums, and of course, taking numerous strolls along the beach.

It is hard to see the devastation from the fires in my hometown, even as I recognize that many states have experienced ravaging fires and other natural disasters, including the state I now call home. It is hard to hear friends and family tell of the incredible loss being experienced, not just loss of home and possessions, but loss of income for so many who worked in the buildings that are no longer there. Unfortunately, we all know what it feels like to witness friends lose everything they own, battle with insurance companies, and begin the painstaking task of starting over.

It is easy to lose heart.

But as I watch the news, I see those crazy Angelinos feeding one another, helping one another, even caring for the pets of their neighbors. Churches and temples are opening their doors for evacuees and giving other congregations a place to worship. I know we did the same here in Colorado when the fires and floods came our way, and that human-kindness gives me hope.

I give thanks for those who are battling these blazes, and pray that God keeps them safe, makes them strong, and brings them aid when they need it. I pray for all those who are playing a role in keeping the people of LA healthy and safe, from the EMTs in the ambulances to the hospital staff, from the Police Officers who guard the streets to the neighbors who look out for each other. I give thanks for the Coloradans going west to fight fires and give aid from the air. We are being our neighbor's keeper, and it gives me hope.

I pray you do not lose heart in the midst of the devastation that seems all too prevalent these days, and that you can find similar signs of hope all around you. God is still with us. God has provided us with caring communities. We are not alone. Share that hope with others!
