

How Would You Describe Your Character?

“Be not deceived: Evil companions corrupt good morals. Awake to soberness righteously, and sin not; for some have no knowledge of God” (1 Corinthians 15:33-34). Sufficient to say, no good can come from running about with evil companions.

The good man out of his good treasure bringeth forth good things: and the evil man out of his evil treasure bringeth forth evil things. And I say unto you, that every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned” (Matthew 12:33-37), so also, our character will be manifested to the world through our actions.

Ultimately, our character is not going to be defined by what we wish it to be, but by how it is manifested in our conduct. The apostle Paul, in his statement to Timothy, said, “But thou didst follow my teaching, conduct, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love, patience, persecutions, [and] sufferings.” Paul puts a premium on conduct. ret
