How to Comply with EPA's EPCRA and 112(r) Reporting Requirements for Chlorine

INTRODUCTION

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region V is sponsoring a series of in-person and web-based training programs this fall for water and wastewater plant operators, and other facilities that have chlorine in a process. These **FREE** training programs will provide participants with the information and tools necessary to comply with EPA's emergency planning, notification, and reporting requirements for chlorine.

OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this training, participants will be able to:

- Identify entities that need to be notified about the amount of chlorine being used or stored at their facility;
- Explain chlorine release notification procedures;
- Explain what should be included in a Risk Management Program and submitted in a Risk Management Plan;
- Describe common compliance deficiencies; and
- Describe best management practices.
