

Purim

Name Purim is celebrated on the 14th of Adar, (March14, 2025). The 13th of Adar is a fast day called in Hebrew "Taanis Esther" to commemorate the fasting period imposed upon Persian Jews by Queen Esther. If Purim falls on Sunday the fast of Esther is observed on the preceding Thursday as fasting is prohibited on the Sabbath. Yom Kippur is the only exception, when it falls on a Sabbath when fasting is mandatory.

As we know, the holiday was given the name Purim to remind us of the lots Haman cast to determine the most favorable day upon which to kill all the Jews of Persia. On the 13th of Adar was chosen. That day the Jews battled and overpowered their enemies. They celebrated their victory the next day.

<u>Megillah</u> On the eve of Purim and the following morning, the Purim story is read in the synagogue. If available it is read from a pardment scroll the way it was in the days of Mordechai and Esther. The parchment is called "Megillah". Before the reading is begun, three blessings are recited: 1. to indicate the fulfillment of the "Mitzvah" of belief in G-d, 2. to thank G-d for the miracle of victory, 3. to thank G-d for enabling us to read this season in health and happiness. If you are ill, it can be read at home.

When Haman's name is mentioned during the readings at the synagogue it is customary to make noise in contempt of the cruel tyrant.

<u>Hamantaschen</u> We are commanded to eat, drink, and rejoice Purim. For this reason a special Purim Feast is prepared, and is marked by song and merriment. A favorite of the Feast is a cake known by its Yiddish name, "Hamantachen". In Hebrew it is called "Oznei Homon" or "Haman's Ears".

Purim should be made a joyous holiday for all, especially those who are less fortunate and afford a Purim Feast. By helping them, we will be bringing happiness to them and ourselves.
