

Outdoor Recess Sun Protection and Insect Repellent

The weather in New England can sometimes be unpredictable – sometimes cooler with rain but as we move into April, it can get unseasonably warm at times. Once warmer temperatures move in, the sun will peek through the trees more during the outside recess. We want to avoid sunburn on sensitive skin. Therefore, please consider applying sunscreen to your child before bringing them to school. If your child has a sun hat or baseball cap that he/she likes to wear, this will also help with the sun on cloudless days. Once the small gnats and other bugs return to our playground, consider applying bug spray at home as well. As full-day students may require an additional application, consider sending in sunscreen and/or insect repellent labeled with your child's name (along with the signed consent form that is available on our website in the Parent Corner tab). Please note that the school does not provide sunscreen/bug repellent/lotion and children may not share these items – only the teachers will apply these items to children.

Footwear: Due to safety reasons, children should wear sneakers or other closed-toe footwear on the playground. Sandals, crocks, open-foot shoes, etc... do not provide foot support for running and climbing. We want to ensure that your children's feet are always protected from woodchips and other objects during play.



We hope everyone enjoyed the April vacation! The school year is quickly flying by! It tends to get very busy at this time of year, so be on the lookout for special event announcements.

We have had a very rainy and muddy Spring so far! Please continue to send your child with rain boots as the playground gets muddy this time of year. An extra pair of socks for your child's cubby also comes in handy. We love to go outside whenever possible and enjoy the nice weather.

Science

In science we have been discussing Earth Day. Earth Day was celebrated on Tuesday, April 22nd. We learned that we should appreciate the Earth and the environment every day. The children learned about the concepts of reduce, reuse, and recycle and what items are able to be recycled, reused and what we should reduce. We learned we need to keep our planet clean to have a healthy environment. We have also been collecting recyclable materials for crafting. The children enjoy turning one person's trash into treasure!



Peace Education

In April we learned about Passover. Passover is celebrated from April 12th- April 20th and during this Jewish holiday, people remember their ancestors who left slavery as they were led out of Egypt. Passover is celebrated by participating in many rituals including eating special foods. Easter was also celebrated in April this year and is a major holiday in Christianity. 
Classroom B Newsletter April 2025

Dear Sunrise Parents,

Springtime typically symbolizes new beginnings as this is when the first green emerges from the ground and the first bud opens. Flowers bloom for the first time in months in contrast to the days of cold, ice and snow. Animals awaken from winter-induced hibernation. The sun shines for more hours each day, bringing an end to the colder weather. The Earth comes "to life" once again and this is also known as the "Re-Birth" season.

Our classroom learned many fascinating things about the transition into spring. April is also a month with many holidays and celebrations including Ramadan, Passover, Good Friday, Easter and Earth Day. Our class discussed each of these holidays and we learned about many of the typical traditions.

Ramadan which is a holy month that is celebrated by Muslims. This holiday has similarities with the traditions celebrated in Christianity and Judaism. Many people fast, reflect and spend time with family while worshiping and praying. The children enjoyed learning about this holy month and made colorful Ramadan Lanterns. During Passover believers restrict their food diets, focus on family, prayer, give thanks, clean the household, and finally celebrate with a special feast.







In Christianity, Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday are celebrated. It is a time of reflection, renewal, prayer and fasting. Those who celebrate these holidays learn about appreciating one another and personal sacrifices in daily life. Our class read stories and completed art projects to celebrate Easter.

Earth Day


A special day when people all around the world think about how to take care of our beautiful Earth. We discussed the importance of what we can do to help keep planet Earth clean and healthy. The children learned about recycling





and made art projects out of things that were collected on our nature walk. We learned how we all can make a difference by simply reducing, reusing and recycling. We continue to discuss the things we use each day and how we all can make an impact on our beautiful planet Earth.

Science and Zoology



This month the children are focusing on themes of renewal and growth. Our class has been learning about the life cycles of plants and animals, including hands-on activities like the parts of a flower, vertebrates and art projects.



Sensorial Area

Spring also offers new sensory experiences, from the feel of soil to the sounds of birds and insects. The children have been engaging with new materials that help them explore different textures, colors, and sounds that are found in nature. Lessons were given on the parts of a bird and insect.



Kindergarten Afternoon

The Kindergarteners are working hard on the beginning phases of reading. Here the Kindergarten children are working during the afternoon work cycle on finding the missing word to complete a sentence.

April 2025 Extended Day Newsletter


The month of April was a busy one for us in extended day.

In **Art** we finished our unit on letter-a-day alphabet crafts, had a Winnie the Pooh theme week, and did various open-ended crafts like sponge painting and sticker work.

In **Science** we got to take home our own handmade rainbow paper (pictured below).

This experiment taught us about thin film interference. Thin film interference occurs when light waves bounce off the top and bottom surfaces of a very thin layer, mix and create colorful patterns. A few examples of this are when you see colors in a bubble or oil spill.





We made the rainbow paper by dropping a few drops of clear nail polish into a bowl of water. Then we dipped a small piece of black construction paper into the water and quickly pulled it out. The nail polish created a film on top of the water and transferred onto the paper creating colorful patterns.



Our second Science unit of the month was an outdoor experiment. We used an old film canister as a rocket. We poured a little water into the canister, added an Alka seltzer tablet into it, and closed the lid. The water and Alka seltzer created a chemical reaction and started bubbling. The lid created pressure and within seconds the "rocket" shot up into the air. The children loved this and wanted to repeat it over and over again.

In honor of **Earth Day**, we focused on gardening. We planted lavender seeds from a biodegradable pencil. The seeds were at the end of the pencil where the eraser would normally be. Each child took turns either filling the pot with soil or watering the soil. We are very excited to watch the lavender grow.
