Goal – Get EMS to the Scene Faster

- In South Skyline Area not six to nine minutes... more like 30 – 90 minutes
- It's harder than it looks.
- "Call Center Dispatchers don't know where you are. It's not like TV!"
 - Lorraina, Dispatch Supervisor, CHP Golden Gate Division Dispatch Center, Vallejo, CA
 - The dispatchers don't know where to dispatch to
 - Responders may not find us

Gather Information before calling 911

- Personal info
- Injuries number of people hurt and extent of injuries
- Where the accident is located this is the hard part!
- Fire?
- # of vehicles involved
- If residential location, be clear about where on the property to go, especially if there is more than one residence!

911 Call Routing

Clara and San Mateo Counties contracted private call center in East Bay)

NEXT TO

► EMS for location you (or they) identified (5 different centers in our area)

AND (for accidents on state highways)

- CHP Golden Gate Dispatch Center, Vallejo
 - Can these folks find you?


911 Calls – Dispatchers' Challenges

- The Call Box Dispatch Center DOES NOT KNOW WHERE YOU ARE LOCATED
 - The call box # you are calling from does not appear on a computer system
 - Your cell-phone coordinates do not appear
 - They are in the East Bay
 - They do not know the local land marks (but can note them)

So why can Uber find me, but 911 can't?

- Smartphones knows your location because you signed up for the app and are using the app's mapping infrastructure
- 911 from the same phone a general area you are calling from – geo-location and tower pinging
- The problem isn't the phones... they have the information
- The problem is the fragmented and aging 911 system, designed for landlines
- 240 million 911 calls a year; 80% from mobile devices

911 - How to call for help

How to call:

- Landline communication and location ID: shows the physical location of the fixed telephone to 911 Dispatcher
- **Call boxes** communication not location ID:
 - The Call Box Dispatch System does NOT automatically show the location; however, if you tell them the Call Box # they can find it
- Cell phones communication not location ID well:
 - If you don't know where you are, dispatch will try to use GPS and Radiolocation (from towers) to get near your location this goes from a couple of hundred yards to within a 100 ft if you continue the call long enough (15 min), but waiting so long defeats purpose of getting a quick response!
 - COMING SOMEDAY Rapid SOS GPS locating system Will plug cell phone location into 911 mapping system – depends on carrier and phone

Your phone - where am 1?

- Longitude and Latitude
 - Open Google maps
 - Click on diagonal arrow to find yourself
 - Tap and hold blue dot:
 - Your coordinates (longitude and latitude) appear below
 - Problem: hard to reliably read off so many digits over poor cell connection
- Three Words (https://what.three.words.com)
 - Represent any address as three words.
 - Easy to speak. Understood by 911
- Avenza Maps offline map app Cal Fire likes to use

911 - Know before you call - LOCATION

- Trail
 - County
 - Park
 - Trail Name
 - Roadway you are closest to
 - Distance from something they can ID (roads are good)
 - ► Latitude and Longitude coordinates (GPS coordinates from your phone on Map apps) / What Three Words

For a park it's often best to call the park rangers – they may well get there faster than 911!


911 - Know before you call - LOCATION

- Highway or roadway accident:
 - Highway you are on
 - County (not as easy as it sounds)
 - Accident's distance from nearest cross street
 - Accident's distance from call box
 - Latitude and Longitude coordinates (GPS coordinates) / What Three Words
 - Add: The nearest EMS to me is:
 - Cal Fire Saratoga Summit Station 21 OR
 - San Mateo County Fire Dept Station 58
 "Please call their emergency line and deploy them"





911 – How/Who to call for help - notes

- 911 Call Center Dispatchers don't care about mile marker info (but CHP Call Center does)
- Calls directly to County Dispatch #s? Same operator, lower priority
- What about Cal Fire Direct? Public phone # is not their priority call line (911 people have the emergency #)
- If no phone or radio Three honks at Cal Fire, MROSD station




County Lines are Tricky – just when you think you've moved into San Mateo County, Palo Alto, in Santa Clara County, inserts itself!






South Skylines' Most Dangerous Corners




The five most dangerous corners in South Skyline Area

Killer Corner - Hwy 9 - 1 mile North of Hwy 35




Killer Corner - Hwy 9 - 1 mile North of Hwy 35







- > Nearest EMS: Cal Fire Saratoga Summit #21




The five most dangerous corners in South Skyline Area




Shingle Mill Road – San Mateo County

- Nearest EMS: Cal Fire Saratoga Summit Station #21




The five most dangerous corners in South Skyline Area


Flipping Corner .2 miles South of Las Cumbres Road



Flipping Corner .2 miles South of Las Cumbres Road Driving South




Flipping Corner .2 miles South of Las Cumbres Rd. Driving North







- Nearest EMS: Cal Fire Saratoga Summit Station #21



- Highway 35 near Skid Road Trail
- 1 mile South of Page Mill/Alpine
- 6 miles North of Cal Fire Saratoga Summit
- East side: Santa Clara County
- West side: San Mateo County
- Latitude: 37.309667, Longitude: -122.168967
- Call box: SM 35 22
- Nearest EMS: Cal Fire Saratoga Summit Station #21

How Do They Find Us?

- Once dispatched, EMS has to find the location a lot of official maps are out of date/incomplete
- SSEPO mapping project corrected and completed maps for about half of South Skyline Area
 - Some neighborhoods did not participate
 - Maps published to EMS only in San Mateo and Santa Cruz counties
- In summer fire stations backfilled by units from out of town
 - They don't always have this information
- We need more focus on completing the mapping exercise!
