Update on Items from 2023 Minutes:

1) Risk Management and Liability

Swimming Area

Following a letter from Transport Canada stating our current swimming buoys do not meet requirements, the buoys were not installed in 2023. To reach compliance the exterior corners of the swim area must be marked with buoys at least 15.25 cm wide and at least 30.5 cm high. These buoys also need to be marked as "PRIV" and "Hamlet of Sunset Beach". We had trouble sourcing the correct buoys in 2023 and are still looking for a reasonably priced source to procure these.

2) Legal Fees

To date Earl has spent over one hundred hours dealing with the RM of Grayson, the Saskatchewan Information and Privacy Commissioner, Municipal Affairs, and Ombudsman Saskatchewan attempting to validate the actual legal expenses and if the RM of Grayson does have the authority to pass these expenses to the Hamlet of Sunset Beach.

Actions taken to date:

- Request additional information from the RM of Grayson to validate the legal expenses were in fact for services pertaining to properties within the Hamlet of Sunset Beach for services delivered in 2023.
 - RM denied the request and we received a letter from MLT Aikins (March 9, 2023) stating invoice amounts and dates. We were not provided any documentation to validate the services rendered, or the dates they were undertaken.
 - On May 10th the RM of Grayson sent an email documenting a meeting resolution stating that legal fees are subject to client privilege and will not be disclosed.
- Earl consulted with Municipal Affairs who advised we should file a Freedom on Information request which was submitted May 12th, 2023.
 - o The FOI review states "LA FOIP does not require the RM to withhold the records from the Applicant. The RM is the client in the solicitor-client privilege. Therefore, the RM has the ability to waive the privilege and release the records at issue, in full or in part. It is bizarre that the Hamlet, which is a part of the RM, has not been given access to at least portions of the records to verify its legal expenses. As noted in the RM's legal counsel's letter dated March 9, 2023 to the Hamlet, organized hamlets are governed by the RM. It is bizarre that the invoices that details regarding legal expenses being allocated to the Hamlet are not readily available to the Hamlet. It is even more bizarre that the Hamlet has needed to submit a formal access to information request under LA FOIP in efforts to try to gain access to the records." And further "I recommend that the RM reconsider the exercise of its discretion to determine if it can release the records at issue, in full or in part, to the Applicant within 30 days of issuance of this Report." The review also agreed with the RM of Grayson "that subsection 21(a) of LA FOIP applies to the records at issue." This effectively means the RM of Grayson's position that these invoices fall under client solicitor privilege and do not need to be released.
 - On September 21, 2023 we receive a letter from the RM of Grayson stating they had reviewed the report and "The RM, or more appropriately the Head, has followed the recommendation of the Commissioner in the Decision and has thoroughly reconsidered the exercise of his discretion to refuse to release the Records. However, the Head has come to the same conclusion, namely, that the Records sought are solicitor-client privileged and will not be disclosed."
- Earl also opened a case with Ombudsman Saskatchewan (File 73779) regarding
 this issue in tandem with the FOI request. The Ombudsman closed the case
 stating there was already a FOI request in place and that the ruling from that
 should take precedent. They felt there was nothing that fell under their
 jurisdiction and there was no help they could provide.

- Since most of the invoices in questions were prior to the initial date the legal fees
 resolution was passed (June 24th) I contacted The Rm of Grayson, Municipal
 Affairs and Ombudsman Saskatchewan to ask if the RM of Grayson had the
 authority to pass a resolution retroactively. Both Municipal Affairs and the
 Ombudsman stated they could not provide definitive answers to this question
 and had no advice to offer. Any further action would have to take place via the
 Saskatchewan legal system.
 - We received a letter from MLT Aikins stating:

"The subject matter of the resolution was the Hamlet's budget for the year 2022. Therefore, Resolution 147/22 pertained to the Hamlet's estimated expenses for all of 2022. As such, the legal fees prior to June 24, 2022 were properly included in the resolution. Resolution 147/22 was not passed retroactively because it was passed during 2022, and only pertained to legal fees incurred on behalf of the Hamlet in 2022. The only way such a resolution would be "retroactive" is if the RM had tried to collect legal fees incurred on behalf of the Hamlet in previous years. Therefore, Resolution 147/22 was not passed retroactively in contravention of the Municipal Bylaw Guide.

We further advise that s. 358(2) of *The Municipalities Act* provides that a resolution of a municipal council may only be challenged within six months after the resolution was passed. As Resolution 147/22 was passed on June 24, 2022, the time to challenge Resolution 147/22 has long since passed."

At this point the hamlet board believes we have exhausted all possible courses of action and intend to drop this issue.

The current fence installed at the break around the boat launch also opens us up to liability.
