Event Details:

We invite you to join your SFGA friends on a Western Carolina Mountain Golf Getaway this summer at the newly renovated Waynesville Inn & Golf Club. Waynesville is located about 30 miles southwest of Asheville between the Great Smoky and Blue Ridge Mountains. At about 3,000 feet in elevation the summer weather is typically less humid and at least 10 degrees cooler than many other parts of the US. The end of the August is a fine time visit as the golf conditions are ideal and the kids are starting to head back to school. In fact, the resort experiences a little lull in business before the busy Labor Day weekend, so they've invited the SFGA to experience their freshly renewed accommodations, restaurants and play their fully renovated 18-hole course. We'll also play two other nearby golf courses, Maggie Valley and Springdale Resort's Golf Course.

With a legacy dating back to 1926 when famed golf architect Donald Ross chose an old dairy farm as the perfect setting for his "Carolina 9" course, the foundation of the Waynesville Inn and Golf Club has always been one of understated excellence. The 165-acre historic property is now home to 18 holes of breathtaking golf, 72 well-appointed guest rooms, 6,000 square of event space, a picturesque Event Lawn and dining that expertly complements any occasion. Members and guests alike can expect state-of-the-art facilities and amenities encapsulated within a legacy as timeless as the surrounding mountain-scape.

Package Inclusions:

- Six nights, with a choice of accommodations at Waynesville Inn & Golf Club, A Tapestry Collection Golf Resort by Hilton. **Choose from**:
 - Golf View Rooms that are in a two-story remodeled motel type building and every room has a patio or balcony that overlooks the 7th & 8th holes of the golf course. These rooms are a little larger than the Inn rooms and are located about a 2-minute walk from the Historic Inn.
 - Or you can stay in Waynesville's Historic Inn King or Queen Bedded Room (these rooms are smaller than the Golf View Rooms but are conveniently located near the resort's restaurants, bar and golf shop)
- Breakfast each morning in The Grill Restaurant inside Waynesville's historic Inn.
- Welcome Reception (open bar) followed by Group Dinner on our first night (August 3, 2025)
- Awards Reception (open bar) followed by Group Dinner on our last night (August 8, 2025)
- Four Rounds of Golf with Carts and Practice Range Balls Prior to each round. Golf will be played at:
 - Waynesville Golf Club (2 Rounds)
 - Maggie Valley Golf Club
 - Springdale Resort's Golf Course at Cold Mountain
- Two tournament rounds where the formats are: 2 Best of 4 and Odds & Even, four-person team play.

Accommodations:

Every room at Waynesville Inn features 50-inch cable TV work desk, clock radio with USB chargers and balcony or patio views of the golf course and mountains. Historic Downtown Waynesville is a 2-minute drive, the Blue Ridge Parkway is a 5-minute drive, Lake Junaluska is a 10-minute drive, and Cherokee, Asheville and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park are 30-minute drives.

The Golf Courses:



WAYNESVILLE GOLF CLUB

In April of 2021 the Raines Company purchased the Waynesville Inn – Golf Resort and Spa. The property was rebranded with a new logo and name, the Waynesville Inn and Golf Club. In partnership with Bobby Weed Golf Design, the course underwent an extensive renovation to become an 18-hole 6,500-yard championship golf course with bent grass tees, fairways and greens. The Original 9 was restored and practice facilities were added including a lighted Himalayan putting green, short game chipping/bunker area, full driving range and par three short course. The transformation was much needed and the results are fantastic. Waynesville always had fun course, now it is completely upgraded and well maintained. This is where our SFGA Golfers will play our first and last rounds during our week-long stay.

SPRINGDALE RESORT GOLF CLUB

The Springdale Golf Club is well-maintained, well-routed, and enjoyable from the first tee to the 18th green. Its surroundings and vistas may soothe even the most aggravating shot. The front nine plays into a valley and the back nine has more of a mountain feel incorporating uphill and downhill elevation changes. The course features stunning views of Cold Mountain and Mt. Pisgah. Overall, the course is fun to play offering generous fairways and receptive greens. Their award-winning club house opened in 2022 and is home to the Rocky Face Tavern which serves both lunch and dinner. The restaurant has a nice dining room and bar and an outstanding terrace overlooking the 18th hole. The golf and food & beverage staff are friendly and professional. This is one of our favorite golf clubs in this part of the Carolina's and we are excited to bring the SFGA there this summer.



MAGGIE VALLEY GOLF CLUB

The golf course at Maggie Valley highlights some of Western North Carolina's most spectacular scenery. This established, 6500-yard course is surrounded by centennial trees and includes 30 acres of fairways leading to large bent grass greens. The front Valley Nine allows players to warm up before tackling the significantly more challenging Mountain Nine, which features an elevation rise of 800 feet and panoramas of the valley and beyond.

WAYNESVILLE INN & GOLF CLUB

The resort offers three different dining options: The Grill, the Watershed Tavern and the Turn House.

- The Grill is open for Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner and is located on the first floor of the Historic Inn. The Grill also has a full-service Bar.
- Watershed Tavern is a Restaurant and Lounge open daily at 4:00pm and is located on the ground level of the Historic Inn directly across from the Golf Shop.
- The Turn House is a Sandwich and Snack Outlet next to the Historic Inn & events lawn and is open from 11:00am until 5:00pm.

Things to do near Waynesville:

ART ENTHUSIASTS MAY FIND THE WAYNESVILLE ART GALLERY SCENE OF INTEREST

Waynesville is Haywood County's oldest town with over a century of experience as a quaint mountain retreat. Even before the railroad made it easy to get here, visitors flocked to the Waynesville for the cool, clean air, clean water, outstanding scenery and an opportunity to escape sweltering cities. Take a stroll down the streets of Downtown Waynesville and visit local galleries. You find pottery thrown by a local artist that is perfect for that empty space on your bookshelf. You'll find jewelry that is as unique as you are. Best yet, you'll find inspiration that you can pack up and take home with you. Recommended stops along the Waynesville Gallery Hop include: Green Hill Gallery (34 N Main Street) · Haywood County Arts Council Gallery & Gifts (86 N. Main Street) · TPennington Art Gallery (15 North Main Street) · Faces of the Wood (137 Depot Street) · Twigs and Leaves Gallery (98 North Main Street) · Jo Ridge Kelley Fine Art & Teaching Studio (136 N Main Street) · Sun Sohovich Art Gallery and Studio (140 N. Main Street, 2nd Floor).

GREAT SMOKEY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK

The Great Smoky Mountains National Park received 14.1 million visitors in 2021. That is more than any other National Park in the United States. The majority of those visitors saw the park by traveling along The Great Smoky Mountains Scenic Byway, otherwise known as Newfound Gap Road or Highway 441. A scenic drive along The Great Smoky Mountains Scenic Byway will take you through the heart of the National Park, allowing you to see historic structures, dense forest, wildlife, and access to the highest peaks and some of the most scenic views available in the park. The road

provides access to many hiking trails and waterfalls as well, including the famous Appalachian Trail. From Waynesville, the Oconoluftee visitor center in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the starting point for the Great Smoky Mountains Scenic Byway in North Carolina. The visitor center is about 45 minutes from Waynesville.

DISCOVER SOCO FALLS

Soco Falls is truly a hidden gem, located just off the Blue Ridge Parkway, not far from Waynesville NC, and just inside the Cherokee Nation boundry. Access the small easy to miss parking area for the trailhead. The short, but not well-maintained trail will take you down to the wooden observation deck for beautiful views of this duel and majestic waterfall. For better views, take the scurry trail down the base of the falls. This option is only recommended for those with climbing and hiking skills.

DALE'S WHEELS THROUGH TIME MUSEUM

The Wheels Through Time Museum is home to the world's premier collection of rare American vintage motorcycles. Located 5 miles from the Blue Ridge Parkway, in beautiful Maggie Valley, NC, this all-American motorcycle museum houses over 300 of America's rarest and most historic classic motorcycles, with over 35 makes on display, including the likes of Harley-Davidson, Indian, Excelsior, Crocker, Henderson, Pope, Elk, Flying Merkel, and Flesher Flyer. The museum is considered one of Western North Carolina's premier museum and tourism attractions and features dozens of motorcycle-related exhibits, ranging from board-track racers, hillclimbers, original paint machines, American Class "C" racing, choppers and bobbers, and one-of-a-kind motorcycles.





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
