Toledo upset Pittsburgh 48-46 in a bowl-record six overtimes at the Game-Above Sports Bowl at Ford Field on Thursday. The game surpassed the previous mark set 48 hours earlier when South Florida beat San Jose State 41-39 in 5 OT's in the Hawaii Bowl on Tuesday.

If you steam chased any line move of 3 or more points (sides and totals) right before kickoff, you are 15-11-1. If you had got in front of the move, you are 20-6-1.

#### Misleading Bowl Finals

**Sam Houston State (+3.5) upset Georgia Southern 31-26.** However, Georgia Southern had a 393-267 yard edge but were -4 in TO's. Sam Houston got a 29-yard "Pick 6" and scored on a 13-yard TD "drive" after another turnover.

**Notre Dame (-7) beat Indiana 27-17.** It was more dominant than the final as Indiana went 76 yards in 12 plays for a TD, recovered an onside kick and went 50 yards in 8 plays for another TD in the final 5 minutes of the game. ND still had a 394-278 yard edge in the game even after those two drives.

**Penn State (-9) beat SMU 38-10.** However, Penn State got a pair of "Pick 6's" and SMU was stopped on downs at the Penn State 19-yard line and intercepted at the Penn State 7-yard line.

**USF (-1) beat San Jose State 41-39 in 5 OT's.** San Jose State did have a 441-291 yard edge. USF got a 93-yard kick return TD. San Jose fumbled in the USF end zone for a touch back and USF got a 16-yard TD "drive" after an interception. It was also a bad beat for UNDER 66.5 bettors as the game was tied at 27-27 entering OT.

**Toledo (+6.5) upset Pittsburgh 48-46 in 6 OT's.** However, Toledo did have a pair of "Pick 6's" in the game.

**Arkansas State (+10) upset Bowling Green 38-31.** However, BG did have a 479-360 yard edge. Arkansas State got a 60-yard punt return TD and BG missed 3 FG's.

**Iowa State (+5) upset Miami, FL 42-41.** However, Miami had a 524-415 yard edge but were -3 in TO's. Also Miami starting QB Cam Ward sat out the second half.

**Nebraska (-3.5) beat Boston College 20-15.** However, BC had five different trips inside the Nebraska 35-yard line result in a combined zero points.

**Miami, OH (-1.5) blew out Colorado State 41-17.** However, Colorado State had a 462-401 yard edge but were -2 in TO's and were stopped on downs at the Miami 2-yard line and 25-yard line.

**Vanderbilt (+3) upset Georgia Tech 35-27.** Georgia Tech did have a 394-306 yard edge but were -2 in turnovers.

#### Bad Beats in Bowl Games

**The total in the Fresno State/Northern Illinois game was 41.** The game was tied 13-13 after regulation but NIU ended up winning 28-20. Fresno should have won it in regulation but missed 3 FG's.

**Syracuse (-18.5) beat Washington State 52-35.** Washington State scored a TD with :09 left to get the back-door. However, you could have bet Syracuse at much better numbers in the weeks leading up to the game as they opened as low as -2.5.

**The total in the Oklahoma/Navy game was 44.** Oklahoma scored a TD with :06 left. Instead of kicking the PAT to force OT, OU went for 2 and didn't convert and lost 21-20. The two teams also missed a pair of FG's in the second half. It was also a misleading final as Oklahoma had a 433-318 yard edge and blew a 14-0 lead.

## Games in Rotation Order

## HOME TEAM IN CAPS

### Tuesday, December 31st

#### Reliaquest Bowl - Raymond James Stadium - Tampa, FL

† **Alabama 30 Michigan 13.** A rematch of last year's CFB Playoff Semifinal which saw Michigan win 27-20 in OT. Safe to say, there's a lot less fanfare this year. However, it is important for both first-year coaches to not lay an egg. Both teams have had many opt outs as Alabama will be without 6 starters. The Tide are depth-shy at WR and DB. Meanwhile, Michigan has 8 starters opting out, many of them expected to go in the first 2 rounds of the draft. Both teams played Top 11 schedules but Alabama was +1.6 in ypp while Michigan was -0.1. The money is on Bama and we agree.

#### Sun Bowl - Sun Bowl Stadium - El Paso, TX

† **Washington 25 Louisville 24.** Both teams were better than their records this year. Louisville was +1.6 in ypp margin (No. 11) vs the No. 25 toughest schedule. Washington was +1.0 in ypp margin vs the No. 19 schedule. Washington has had 23 players hit the portal while Louisville has lost 6 starters to opt out including QB Tyler Shough. If everyone was healthy, Louisville would be around a 6-to-7 point favorite. We haven't made a bet on side or total but Washington feels like the right side especially with ACC teams currently 0-10 ATS this bowl season.

#### Citrus Bowl - Camping World Stadium - Orlando, FL

† **South Carolina 29 Illinois 20.** South Carolina is one of the hottest teams in the country with 6 straight wins and they covered their games this year by an average of 9.4 ppg (9-3 ATS). The Gamecocks are much better in the stats (+1.2 vs +0.4 in ypp margin) and played the tougher schedule (No. 20 vs No. 53). Both teams have had minimal opt outs besides SC DE Kyle Kennard, RB Raheim Sanders and Illinois WR Pat Bryant. The market has been back and forth on the game but Illinois +10 money showed yesterday. Pass.

#### Texas Bowl - NRG Stadium - Houston, TX

† **Baylor 31 Lsu 28.** LSU has many more opt outs than Baylor. The Tigers have 7 starters out and have had 17 players hit the transfer portal. Baylor has lost one starter to the portal. Baylor was the better team in ypp margin (+0.8 vs +0.3) but LSU played the tougher schedule (No. 7 vs No. 49). LSU's offense is really depleted losing

two starting WR's, their TE and top 2 OL. We've seen a lot of money come in on Baylor who opened +3 and now find themselves -3.5. At current, we prefer the UNDER more than anything.

### CFB Playoff Quarterfinal

#### Fiesta Bowl - State Farm Stadium - Glendale, AZ

† **Penn State 33 Boise State 20.** Penn State is the much better team in the stats (+2.1 vs +1.2 in yards per play margin). The Nittany Lions also played the much tougher schedule (No. 30 vs No. 80). Boise RB Ashton Jeanty needs just 132 yards to break Barry Sanders' single-season rushing record. Jeanty set records for yards after contact (1,889 yards) missed tackles forced (135). Obviously, Penn State will try to slow him down. The game will likely come down to Boise QB Madsen. He's only thrown 3 interceptions this season and will have to avoid the costly mistakes that severely hurt SMU QB Jennings vs Penn State in the first round. Penn State's defense has struggled defending teams who spread you out. Unfortunately for Boise backers, the Broncos don't play that style.

### Wednesday, January 1st

#### CFB Playoff Quarterfinal

#### Peach Bowl - Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Atlanta, GA

† **Texas 32 Arizona State 19.** Texas just played in this stadium for the SEC Championship game. Arizona State is one of the best ATS teams in the country at 11-2 but they haven't played a single opponent inside the Top 20 of our power ratings and Texas ranks No. 3. The Longhorns are the better team in the stats (+2.1 vs +1.1 in ypp margin) and played the tougher schedule (No. 13 vs No. 43). ASU's offense revolves around RB Cam Skattebo who had a combined 2,074 rushing and receiving yards. Much like Jeanty, Skattebo is known for creating missed tackles with 104 and has 1,085 yards after contact. ASU QB Sam Leavitt has been a pleasant surprise this season ranking No. 9 in QBR but will be without his top receiver in Jordyn Tyson (1,101 yards). The ASU OL ranks No. 101 in run blocking grade and will be facing one of the best defenses in the country. After allowing a season-worst 412 yards vs Clemson, we expect a much better effort out of the Texas D here. Also Texas' offense should have their way with a Sun Devils defense that struggles to get pass rush.

### **CFB Playoff Quarterfinal**

#### **Rose Bowl - Rose Bowl - Pasadena, CA**

† **Ohio State 29 Oregon 28.** A rematch of what was arguably the best game of the CFB season so far. The Ducks upset the Buckeyes 32-31 as 3-point home underdogs back on October 12th. Oregon's offense had 496 yards and actually left points on the field as they missed a FG, an extra point and were stopped on downs at the Ohio State 2-yard line. It was the only game all season that Ohio State's defense allowed more than 17 points and 275 yards. We're expecting a track meet again here. Oregon QB Dillon Gabriel ranks No. 2 in QBR and has plenty of weapons led by WR Tez Johnson. It will be interesting to see what type of adjustments the Buckeyes make this go around vs the Ducks. OSU's CB's were put on an island as they played Cover 1 31% of the time. Denzel Burke allowed 7 receptions for 162 yards and 2 TD's. A matchup to keep an eye on is up front on both sides. In the first matchup, the Oregon OT's easily handled Ohio State's dynamic EDGE players Jack Sawyer and J.T. Tuimolou. On the other side, Ohio State was healthier on the OL in the first game while Oregon was missing EDGE Jordan Burch. Now the Buckeyes are missing two starting OL and Burch is back. Obviously, OSU is coming off one of the most dominant performances by any team in CFB this season as they crushed Tennessee. We're expecting another instant classic with the Buckeyes coming out on top this time. We like OVER.

### **CFB Playoff Quarterfinal**

#### **Sugar Bowl - Caesars Superdome - New Orleans, LA**

† **Georgia 23 Notre Dame 20.** While we're expecting a track meet at the Rose Bowl, this game will be more like a rock fight. The big story will be Georgia QB Gunner Stockton making his first career start. He looked good early vs Texas in the SEC Championship as he started 4 of 5 for 43 yards. However, his last 13 attempts gained just 15 net yards including a pair of sacks. He is more mobile than Carson Beck but is obviously a downgrade in the passing game. We expect UGA to lean on their OL which is now healthy and has an average weight of 317 pounds. Meanwhile, ND's DL is banged up as they will be missing DT Rylie Mills who led the team with 7.5 sacks. The Irish are also under-sized up front as their average weight is 277 pounds on the 2-deep. We do expect ND to play man coverage and load the box as they have one of the best secondaries in the country. They are 1st in passing success rate allowed, No. 1 in EPA/Dropback and have the highest man coverage grade in the country. On the other side, which UGA defense will show up? The one that dominated Texas in two meetings or the one that struggled vs the QB run game vs Georgia Tech? ND's rush attack could be the most dangerous in the country considering they have Love, Price and QB Leonard who combined have 2,491 rush yards, 6.6 yards per carry and 38 rushing TD's. Georgia is 3-0 all-time vs Notre Dame with wins by 17-10, 20-19 and 23-17. We're expecting something similar here. Kirby Smart has won 7 straight post-season games by an average of 24.6 ppg. We like UGA and UNDER.

### **Thursday, January 2nd**

#### **Gator Bowl - TIAA Bank Field - Jacksonville, FL**

† **Ole Miss 33 Duke 16.** Duke only has 5 players in the transfer portal but one of them was starting QB Maalik Murphy. Henry Beilin will get the start. While Ole Miss could be missing at least 5 starters, many have opted to play including QB Jaxson Dart. Ole Miss is No. 2 in ypp margin and played a more difficult schedule than Duke (No. 55 vs No. 67). These are typically the games where head coach Lane Kiffin doesn't have his team focused but we have seen the money come in on Ole Miss especially with ACC teams performing so poorly. Lean UNDER which is 10-2 in Ole Miss games this year.

### **Friday, January 3rd**

#### **First Responder Bowl - Gerald J Ford Stadium - Dallas, TX**

† **Texas State 36 North Texas 25.** A lot of money on Texas State and the UNDER so far. It makes sense considering North Texas has lost starting QB Morris, Top WR Sheffield, their TE and 3 starting OL. The Mean Green will start Drew Mestemaker at QB. On the other side, Texas State is down 7 starters too led by RB Mahdi. Can you trust Texas State in this spot though? The Bobcats have been favored in every game so far this season and somehow have 5 losses. We lean NT.

#### **Mayo Bowl - Bank of America Stadium - Charlotte, NC**

† **Minnesota 26 Virginia Tech 17.** Quietly, VT could be one of the most ravaged bowl teams. A recent practice had as many as 15 starters out of the line-up. The OL, DL and DB rooms look to be decimated with at least 3 starters out in each group. It also looks like VT QB Drones will be out and Schlee or Watkins will start at QB. Meanwhile, Minnesota is down just 3 starters as of now. The two teams are similar in the stats (both +0.6 in ypp margin) and played similar strength of schedules. PJ Fleck has guided Minnesota to 5 straight bowl wins. Make it 6!

### **Saturday, January 4th**

#### **Bahamas Bowl - Thomas Robinson Stadium - Nassau, Bahamas**

† **Buffalo 26 Liberty 24.** Liberty is better in the stats at +0.8 in ypp margin vs Buffalo's -0.4. Liberty played the weakest schedule in the country (No. 134) but Buffalo played the 2nd weakest. However, Buffalo has been the team taking money the last couple of weeks. It starts with Liberty missing 8 starters and having 17 players in the transfer portal led by QB Kaidon Salter. Meanwhile, Buffalo has a total of 2 players in the portal. We originally had Liberty in the straight up confidence contest (see next page) but now we're calling for Buffalo to win.

Every Sunday in Vegas at 11am PT, Circa Sports is the first book in the world to release CFB lines and we bet them every week. We think it's the best value bets we make all week. 2020 was the first season where we tracked every single bet we made and posted them in the weekly newsletters. We were very pleased with our 119-76-3 (61%) record on these Sunday bets with an average line value of 2.6 ppg! In 2021, we were 224-196-5 (53.3%) vs the Circa openers with an average line value of 1.8 ppg. In 2022, we were 314-262-14 (54.5%, CLV 417-122-51 +1.65 ppg). Last year we were 405-358-6 (53.4%, CLV 577-137-55 +2.09 ppg). Below is some of what we bet already. ## HOME TEAM IN CAPS

### Saturday, January 4th

**BALTIMORE 29 Cleveland 12.** With a win, Baltimore clinches the AFC North and the No. 3 seed. Last week Baltimore QB Lamar Jackson broke the NFL career rushing record for QB's (6,110 yards, Michael Vick 6,109). The Ravens are playing their best ball of the season with 3 straight blowout wins. The Browns are just playing out a miserable 3-13 season. On the bright side, Myles Garrett became the first player in league history to at least 14 sacks in four straight seasons. If Baltimore gets out to a huge lead, will Jackson play much in the second half? Lean **UNDER**.

**Cincinnati 25 PITTSBURGH 22.** The Bengals come in off the thrilling 30-24 OT win over Denver last Saturday. It was their first win this season against a team with a winning record. They need a win here and some help on Sunday if they are to make the playoffs. QB Joe Burrow has passed for at least 250 yards and 3 TD's in each of the last 8 games, a NFL record. The Steelers did not handle their grueling 3 games in 11 days schedule going 0-3 SU and 0-3 ATS losing by at least 14 points to Philadelphia, Baltimore and Kansas City. They don't have as much to play for other than ending their rival's season. Check weather, could be snow in the forecast. We like Cincinnati here.

### Sunday, January 5th

**TAMPA BAY 29 New Orleans 15.** Tampa Bay can clinch their fourth straight division title by winning this game. Last week they played like a team determined to do whatever is necessary to make the playoffs in their 48-14 blowout of Carolina. They're taking on a New Orleans team just playing out the season with a backup QB. Fantasy players note that WR Mike Evans needs at least 85 yards receiving to tie Jerry Rice's NFL record of 11 consecutive seasons with 1,000-plus yards receiving. We could only bet Tampa in this one.

**Buffalo 20 NEW ENGLAND 17.** The Bills are locked into the No. 2 seed and will likely rest some players here. It's been a rewarding seasons considering the offseason saw the departure of six of eight team captains - including WR Stefon Diggs being traded to Houston. They have now won a franchise-best 13 games for the fifth time in team history and have won five consecutive AFC East titles. New England is a miserable 3-13 and were non-competitive vs the Chargers last week. They did just lose by only 3 at Buffalo two weeks ago. Pass.

**GREEN BAY 25 Chicago 16.** If the Bears lose, it will be the first 11-game losing streak in a single season in franchise history. Somehow they covered last week in a 6-3 home loss to Seattle where the Bears offense managed just 179 yards and 3.1 yards per play. QB Caleb Williams has now been sacked a franchise-record 67 times. Meanwhile, Green Bay is safely in the playoffs but did lose to Minnesota last week. It is troubling the Packers are 0-5 this season against the top 3 teams in the NFC. However, they always handle the Bears. We don't see much value.

**Miami 20 N.Y. JETS 19.** Miami still has playoff hopes thanks to Tyler Huntley who steeped in for the injured Tua Tagovailoa last week. Miami needs to win here and hope the Denver Broncos lose at home to Kansas City. It's been a disastrous season for the Jets. New York will finish with five or fewer wins for the seventh time over a 14-season playoff drought - the NFL's longest active streak. QB Aaron Rodgers was pulled last week in favor of Tyrod Taylor with Buffalo leading 40-0. Rodgers, who entered last week, with 499 career TD passes and looking to become just the fifth player to reach 500, was shut out and became the NFL's most sacked quarterback. The 41-year old has now been sacked 568 times, moving ahead of Tom Brady (565). While Miami has everything to play for, the Jets have been the better team in the stats (+0.2 vs -0.1 in ypp margin) and we're not sure we can trust Huntley if he starts on the road. Pass.

**DENVER 26 Kansas City 15.** Kansas City has locked up the No. 1 seed in the AFC for the 4th time in the last 7 years as they try to become the first ever team to win 3 straight Super Bowls. They don't have anything to play for and will rest starters. Meanwhile, Denver has everything to play for. The Broncos just have to win and they are in the playoffs. They had a chance to clinch a playoff berth last week but lost 30-24 in OT to the Bengals. It's a lot of points to lay but we could only bet Denver here.

**L.A. Chargers 23 LAS VEGAS 17.** The Chargers clinched a playoff berth in their dominant 40-7 win over the Patriots. It is the 4th time in 5 NFL seasons that head coach Jim Harbaugh has gotten his team to the postseason. QB Justin Herbert became the 3rd QB in NFL history to have at least 3,000 yards passing and 20 TD passes in each of his first five seasons. Meanwhile, the Raiders have won two straight. Last week they beat New Orleans 25-10. This coming after flight delays so long on Saturday that players didn't get into their New Orleans hotel until after midnight - less than 12 hours before kickoff. TE Bowers' seven catches for 77 yards gave him 108 receptions for 1,144 yards this season, eclipsing Mike Ditka's 1961 rookie tight end mark of 1,067 yards receiving and Puka Nacua's 2023 mark of 105 catches by a rookie at any position. The 108 receptions are also a single-season franchise record. The Chargers could be playing for the 5th seed which would feature a matchup against a struggling Houston team. Harbaugh is not the type of coach to rest a bunch of guys.

**INDIANAPOLIS 24 Jacksonville 20.** The Colts came into last week needing to win their final two games and also get help to make the playoffs but somehow lost outright to the Giants as 7-point favorites. Meanwhile, Jacksonville has played hard all year. Despite a 4-12 record, they are 8-7-1 ATS and won outright last week. Neither team has much to play for, but we actually prefer Jacksonville's consistency in performance over a Colts team that is just 2-6 ATS down the stretch.

**ATLANTA 28 Carolina 19.** The Falcons lost control of their chances of winning the NFC South and ensuring a home playoff game with last week's OT loss to Washington. They now need to beat Carolina and for the Buccaneers to lose to New Orleans to qualify. Rookie QB Michael Penix was 19 of 35 for 223 yards with a TD pass and an interception last week. Carolina was destroyed by Tampa last week. We don't expect to be involved unless the Tampa game is going bad and Atlanta gets new life.

**Washington 25 DALLAS 20.** The Commanders clinched a playoff berth in dramatic fashion last week winning 30-24 in OT. It was another comeback as they trailed 17-7 at halftime. QB Jayden Daniels ran for a season-high 127 yards. With a win, the Commanders would move up to the sixth seed and likely play at Tampa Bay or the Rams. They otherwise would be the seventh seed and visit division-rival Philadelphia unless Green Bay loses to Chicago. Safe to say, they'd prefer to avoid Philly. Dallas would have preferred to avoid the Eagles this entire season as they lost both matchups by a combined 75-13 including 41-7 last week. Dallas had won 4 of 5 games coming into last week but now will be thinking about tee times for next week.

**Seattle 21 L.A. RAMS 17.** The Rams have already clinched the NFC West and will likely rest some starters here. They were not impressive in their 13-9 win over Arizona last week as they were outgained 396-257 but were +2 in TO's. Seattle lost doesn't have much to play for except pride. However, with a first-year staff getting to 10 wins would be an accomplishment considering their season win total was only 7.5. The Rams have controlled the series winning 3 straight and 11 of their last 15. However, the early sharp money is on Seattle here and we agree.

**ARIZONA 24 San Francisco 20.** It's been one of the most disappointing seasons in San Francisco history. The 49ers who had made at least the NFC Championship game in 4 of the last 5 seasons are just 6-10. That's despite ranking No. 2 in the NFL in yards per play margin. Injuries have ravaged them. San Francisco played hard on MNF but saw their 21-13 halftime lead evaporate in the second half to the Lions. They're taking on an Arizona team with also not much to play for. The Cardinals did upset the 49ers back on October 6th as 7-point road underdogs. Does Purdy play?

**TENNESSEE 19 Houston 18.** Houston has already clinched the AFC South and will not have much to play for here as they are locked into the No. 4 seed. A case can be made that Houston will be the worst team in the playoffs this season. On Christmas, they were embarrassed at home 31-2 to Baltimore. Speaking of embarrassments, the Titans are having one of the worst ATS seasons in NFL history. Tennessee is just 2-14 ATS. They get bet on almost every week as their stats are decent for a 3-13 team (just -0.2 in ypp margin despite playing a tough schedule). CJ Stroud likely doesn't play here and the Titans will probably play a couple of QB's. This feels more like a preseason game. Pass.

**DETROIT 30 Minnesota 26.** The most important game in the NFL this season. The winner gets the No. 1 seed in the NFC. The loser falls to the No. 5 seed and becomes the first 14-game winner to play in the wildcard round in NFL history. Detroit won the earlier meeting 31-29 as 1.5-point underdogs. The two teams are both 11-4-1 ATS. Detroit is 7-1 in games decided by one possession, Minnesota is 9-1 in such games. Detroit ranks higher in our power ratings and DVOA (No. 2 vs No. 7). They have also played the tougher schedule. They are playing on one day less rest having been on the West Coast on Monday Night winning a shoot out over the 49ers. Ford Field has become one of the toughest places to play in the NFL the last couple of years. We lean Detroit and also the **UNDER** which is the highest totals line in the NFL this season.

**PHILADELPHIA 20 N.Y. Giants 17.** The Eagles locked up the NFC East with a dominant 41-7 win over Dallas last week. RB Saquon Barkley ran for 167 yards to top 2,000 on the season and needs 101 in this week's game to top Eric Dickerson's record 2,105 yards for the L.A. Rams back in 1984. With the Eagles no longer having much to play for team wise, it's likely QB Hurts will rest another week and now, backup Kenny Pickett could be sidelined as well - possibly forcing Tanner McKee into the starting lineup. The Giants snapped a franchise-record 10-game losing streak last week. However, it also lost their grip of having the No. 1 overall pick in the draft. QB Drew Lock had four touchdown passes and a late TD run. The 45 points were the most for New York since putting up 49 in a 52-49 loss to the Saints in 2015. We don't expect to be involved.
