## **From the Pastor ~ Outreach Opportunities**

We sing!

"Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America express unity but not uniformity in their communion practices. Congregations do use bread and wine, as set forth in the ELCA's set of priorities for the practices of word and sacraments, *The Use of the Means of Grace:* In accordance with the words of institution, this church uses bread and wine in the celebration of the Lord's Supper (Principle 44)." Excerpted from www.elca.org/worshipfaq

There are two opinions and rationales concerning what kinds of bread are used. Those who use leavened bread point to this being the most ancient attested practice of the Church (verified through paintings, mosaics, texts and sculptures). Leavened bread gives witness to the connection between the Eucharist (Holy Communion) and ordinary life. Those who use unleavened bread point to the Jewish Passover during which three of the four gospels recount Jesus' Last Supper took place (the gospel of John, alternately, states the Last Supper occurred before Passover began).
