Westmoreland City Council June 13, 2024 minutes

The Westmoreland City Council met on June 13, 2024 at the Westmoreland Community Center for its monthly meeting.

Governing Body members present: Councilmembers, Jim Smith, Waide Purvis, John Coleman and Bruce Meininger.

There being a quorum present, Mayor, Mark S. Jack called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Agenda: Councilmember Meininger moved to approve the agenda with the amended item added. Councilmember Coleman seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

Consent Items: Councilmember Smith moved to approve the consent items. Councilmember Purvis seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

Public comments on non-agenda items: Heath Eisenbarth asked Council if it would be ok to hang up a banner at the RV Park at the intersection of Hwy 99 and Campbell St for his fireworks stand. Council agreed it would be fine.

Scott Garman wanted an update as to what was decided to help the speeding on Mainstreet. Rice said he could see if the radar sign would be available for that area.

NEW BUSINESS-

Todd Prockish-Sewer Extension at 212 State St.: Todd asked if the City would be willing to pay for the sewer extension project and turn over to specials. Bob will get in contact with Summer and SMH to get the ball rolling.

Wanting our assistance to apply for the Middle-Income House Grant offered by the Kansas Housing Investor Resource Corporation: Ann-Marie asked if we could

do another letter of support to try for this grant again for the lots off of Frontier. They said to have every member sign this letter.

Tornado Update: Long Term Recovery Group is formed; there's a town hall meeting being held on June 30th at the Community Center and Educational Building. This is to help those who were affected and to get them the assistance they need.

Caring Community Foundation Update: Money has been distributed to those in need. There are applications to be filled out. Not sure how much longer this will be available.

Passing of Ordinance #602- Adding 25 cent charge to utility billing:
Councilmember Purvis moved to approve Ordinance 602 as presented. Councilmember
Meininger seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

Passing of Resolution #02-24- adding lights at tennis court: Councilmember Meininger moved to approve Ordinance 602 as presented. Councilmember Coleman seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

Discuss the Westy Logo: Purvis brought up to the Council that he'd like to change the logo for the city of Westmoreland. Councilmember Coleman moved to approve the change of the logo to the wagon wheel with #WestyStrong on it. Councilmember Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.



Grant opportunities- Rural Champions: Jeremy Lehning wanted to bring this to our attention, there's a board that's trying to help smaller communities improve their city. Jeremy had the park in mind for this grant. Waide asked Council to look the form over and Jeremy will come to the next meeting to give more detail.
