Hazzan's Notes

Dear Friends,



In May this year we will be counting the days of the Omer from Pesah to Shavuot in June and remembering what our ancestors went through in moving from a newly liberated people to becoming a well-known force in the Levant region. We also remember the sheaves of grain that were brought in First Temple times to the great altar at the Temple to be accounted for by the divine. Closer to Pesah, barley was brought to the temple and closer to Shavuot wheat was brought. This account reminds us of how agrarian a people we are and how we still tie ourselves to our roots in this manner.

On Shabbat, to remind us of the Omer, we do 2 things. First, we chant a special melody for Lecha Dodi during this time period which is an ancient melody for the Sefirat Haomer period that Mozart later used in his opera, *Le Nozze di Figaro*. And second, we literally count the days of the Omer in very specific fashion with either a melody created by the British Jewish choir Master, Samuel Alman, in a traditional manner or a more modern version composed by the British/Israeli Hazzan Meir Finkelstein. Thus, on 2 accounts each week, we remember the Omer's counting as important for us in preparation for Shavuot that will occur in June this year.

We look forward to seeing you each week at services during this period!




Beth Shalom of Whittier Lunch & Learn Cantors in the Novies

Omer

As recorded in our Torah, when the Jews reached Canaan they were to make it a holy land. In the spring when the first sheaves of grain were to be harvested, thanks were given to G-d. Before any of the new grain could be eaten, a special "Omer" (measure of grain) offering was to be brought to the Temple. This "Omer" offering was to be brought on the second day of Passover. From that day seven weeks were to be counted. On the 50th day another offering was to be brought to the Temple; this was the offering of the first fruits, the "Bikurim".

The day of the "Omer" were days of great joy. Unfortunately, these days of happiness were changed to days of sadness years later in the time of Rabbi Akiva. It was during the days of the "Omer" that a plague attached his 24,000 students of witch many of them died. From that time on the days of the "Omer" are observed as days of mourning in consideration of the great tragedy.

Laws of the "Omer" The Omer is counted for seven full weeks beginning with the second night of Passover. It is counted in the evening after the "Ma'ariv" service. The blessing praising G-d's name is recited. This is followed by counting the number of weeks and days that have passed in the Omer if one has forgotten to count the "Omer" at night he/she must count it on the following day, without the blessing. The following night however, they must count again normally. If they accidentally skipped an entire day, they shall still count, but they should no longer recite the blessing. At the conclusion of the Sabbath or Passover the "Omer" is counted before the "Havdalah" service is recited.

Lag Ba Omer In contrast to other days of the "Omer" the 33 day is a day for rejoicing. History tells us that none of Rabbi Akiva's students died on that day of the plague. It was also on this day General Bar Kochba following Rabbi Akiva's direction won a great victory in the revolution of the Jews against a Roman legion. Concisely, on this day none of the laws of mourning apply. This festival is called in Hebrew Lag Ba'omer. Lag being the Hebrew letters for 33 Ba'omer meaning, "in the Omer".
