Coping with an influx of people coming to Westbrook due to other areas being closed caused an additional burden as well as many of our entertainment and restaurant venues being shuttered or open with many restrictions. We have also contributed monetary assistance to our Social Services Dept. so they can provide help to our less fortunate.

They filled us in on some of the hardships our fellow residents are going through. Inability to pay basic bills, fuel, food, rent and not being able to meet their Copay charges for needed medical matters ETC. Loneliness, depression and other psychological problems. Just the tip of the Iceberg! We are also looking to help the Senior Center with a new program. A phone a friend. Taking a few minutes to chat with someone who is more or less alone. To see how they are doing and to help cheer them up. More to come on that.
