



# Trailer inspection requirements to be more strictly enforced

New owners of some of almost 600,000 travel trailers, boat trailers and utility trailers registered with the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles may be surprised when they next receive notice to renew their annual trailer registration.

Some will learn they have been violating a law of which they were not aware.

As of March 1, registration renewal notices sent to owners of trailers with expired registration are notification that the trailer is required to have passed a safety inspection at a state-certified vehicle inspection station within 90 days prior to the new registration's sticker being issued. Without proof of safety inspection, you cannot renew your trailer registration.

"Some trailer owners haven't been aware of the safety inspection requirement," said Candy Southerland, management analyst with Texas DMV. "Tve even talked with trailer dealers who were surprised when they learned certain trailers fall under the inspection requirements."

#### Ignored for years

Texas law has for decades required annual safety inspection of trailers with a gross weight (weight of trailer plus its carrying capacity or actual load) of more than 4,500 pounds. That includes travel trailers, most dual-axle boat trailers and many larger utility trailers such as those hunters use to haul tractors, ATVs, blinds and other equipment to hunting leases.

Most Texans were unaware

Texas DMV has no way to reliably estimate the rate of non-compliance with the trailer safety inspection requirement, Southerland said. While officers have regularly written citations when they encounter violations of trailer inspection requirements, overall enforcement of the requirement has been modest.

#### **Inspection first**

Under a law passed by the 2013 session of the Texas Legislature, annual vehicle safety inspection requirements will remain the same, but certification stickers will no longer be issued. In-

spection stations will send electronic notification to the DMV that a vehicle (trailer, motor vehicle) has passed the safety inspection and issue a certification document to the vehicle owner.

Before a vehicle can be registered or renew current registration and is issued an annual registration sticker, the vehicle owner must have proof, either in the DMV database or by showing the inspection document, that the vehicle has a currently valid safety inspection. This is similar to the requirement that the owner of a motor vehicle show proof of insurance before being able to get a motor vehicle inspected or registered.

Because expiration dates of safety inspection certification and vehicle registration are, in many cases, different, the new law will be phased in over the coming year until, in 2016, both safety inspection and registration will be due the same month. Safety inspections will have to be done within 90 days of the registration expiring.

With the new law making it impossible to register

a new vehicle or renew a registration without that vehicle having passed a safety inspection, trailer owners who were either unaware of the inspection requirement or simply ignored it and took their chances will be forced to get those trailers inspected.

#### Finding a station

While most of the 11,000 state-certified vehicle inspection stations in Texas are certified to inspect trailers, some are not. And some have limited space and might not be able to accommodate a large travel trailer or particularly large boats and their trailers. A searchable database of Texas vehicle inspection stations is available on the Texas Department of Public Safety's website: dps.texas.gov.

To pass the safety inspection, the trailer must have an operational brake system, tires and wheel assembly that meets state requirements, and all lights — tailights, brake lights, license plate light, side-marker lights and clearance lights — must be operational. Also, the trailer must have side and rear reflectors.




