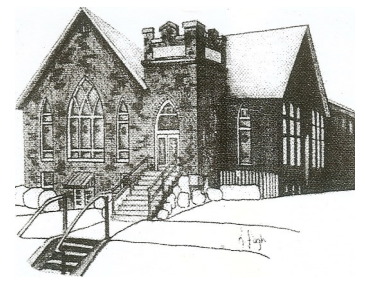

“Give us a king to govern us”!

One of the things that never ceases to amaze me is how terrible and blatantly false political attack ads become as elections approach. Blatant lies, misleading statements, and a whole host of nasty accusations dominate our screens and airways. Running and campaigning for public office has become such a nasty and vile affair. And yet, some how, we still look to our elected leaders as the means to better our lives. We believe that certain politicians can “save the day” while by in large we all agree that politics is not a pretty sight.

We sometimes forget that political discourse is found throughout the scriptures. From rulers making horrifying decisions like enslaving people or ordering the death of all male children, to knowing which nations are allies and which nations are enemies, to kings and rulers being chosen by God; there are plenty of ways that politics plays out in the bible.

As election day draws closer I am reminded of the Israelites asking God to give them a ruler that they like. Samuel was a prophet and leader who was raised by the Priest Eli. You may remember the calling of Samuel as the Lord called to him in his sleep and he answered, “here I am LORD”. Anyway Samuel has grown up. He has risen in stature in the eyes of God and man, and has defeated the Philistines and kept them at bay. He was a good and faithful servant of God. But he was getting older and the people did not trust Samuel’s sons so they ask Samuel to pick for them a king. Samuel does not like that idea at all and goes on to tell them all of the reasons why having a king is a bad idea. He tells them that a king will take their sons to use in war, will take their daughters as entertainment, and that a king will take their lands. But the people will not be swayed, they want a king so that they can be like other nations. They want a king to watch over them, protect them, and keep them safe.

Samuel takes their request to God. This is how God responds, God says, “Listen to all that the people are saying to you; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king.”

As we go to the polls to elect the leaders of our community, state, and nation. Let us remember the mistake made by the Israelites. We should vote, we should participate in democracy, we should vote our conscience as we are guided by our faith in God; but we should not elevate any politician to the point of thinking they are the answer, or worse, our savior. There is only one savior. Only one worthy of our full trust and hope and He is not on the ballot. We must not replace God with a ruler, governor, senator, or any other politician. They will ultimately disappoint, but God is faithful to the thousandth generation. As the inscription on the coins in our pocket says, “In God we Trust”! I trust in my King over any politician, I hope you will too.
