The weekly, quarterly and annual cleaning programs, as well improved personal hygiene practices have been proven by blood lead level testing showing "back to normal" readings for typical shooters.

I must convey my personal thanks to Bob Fellows who rounded up this family men to rebuild the backstop backsplash panels in front of the bullet trap. We expect the new design to be easier and cheaper to repair in the future. Please note, Bob also participates in the weekly cleaning program during the indoor shooting season. He, therefore, earned no additional dues credits for the work done on the backstop.

Dave Leight spent a couple off weekends installing a water heater in the club house. Unfortunately, the old pipes and faucets all leaked and were well beyond repair. Dan First came to the rescue by securing a quotation for new pipes throughout the building and new sinks in the washrooms. I understand that Dan also assisted the plumber to help reduce labor costs to the club. A million thanks to these active club members for their time, talents and use of their tools.

Pistol Match Director Position Open

This is an urgent plea for someone to pick up the Pistol Match Directorship for the club. Paul Baumann has been running the pistol matches for 10 years and deserves a break. We were very fortunate to have Ron Settle pick up the job for a year before his regular job demands took precedence. More recently, George Albrecht took on the responsibility and he too had to resign the position due to a change in his professional obligations. So, we have had to lean on Paul who has graciously volunteered to get us back on track, at least with the upcoming "Octoberfest" 1800 competition.

Paul is willing to work with a new Match Director to provide the necessary instruction and materials involved in scheduling planning and promoting the three regular events that we sponsor each year. The "Octoberfest" is already set up with the NRA. The NRA Indoor Pistol Sectional, generally run in January, must still be sanctioned. We also have the opportunity to sponsor the Wisconsin State Indoor Pistol Championships again this year. However, this even must be applied for, and the application has not yet been submitted.

The job requires a few hours of administrative activities to schedule the activities, promote them to local shooters, prepare the range for each event, and tabulate and report the results. Promotion generally involves e-mails to the list of regular competitive shooters and sending flyers to other competition sponsors, such as the Beloit Range that holds the Wisconsin Outdoor Pistol Championships in the summer. Range preparation includes masking the target area with brown paper, insuring sufficient targets are available and coordinating range officers (club members) to run the range during the competitions.

We already have regular volunteer range officers who are always willing to help out. Often shooters will show up one relay early or stay one relay after competing to serve as range officers. So, you won't be alone on the range.

All in all, the job is what you make it. Paul has established a very good relationship with the other clubs. Southport not only makes good money at these events, but also remains a leader in advancing the sport. Being the only local club featuring turning targets, we have an obligation to offer indoor Conventional Pistol competitions to the shooting community.

Please consider taking on the responsibilities of Pistol Match Director for a year or so. This is a good opportunity to do your share for the club. ***Please note: the Match Director pays no dues during his term of service.***

Highway 50 Access Road Repair

You have surely noticed that the condition of the frontage road that serves the club is in bad need of repair. We have contacted Pleasant Prairie, Kenosha County and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation about getting it repaired. Although the County has traditionally serviced this roadway, at the direction of the DOT, all of our pleas for maintenance have fallen on deaf ears. The DOT has deemed this steep, hairpin turn, directly off of a 50MPH highway, on the downside of an overpass with no exit lane, as a "shared driveway." An appeal was made by the club, including the other property owners, to our elected officials. All of whom, to date, report that they can do nothing. In stead, we are advised to secure legal council to challenge the decision of the State. The lawmakers actually asked, "do you have a lawyer in the club?"

It ain't over yet, but in the mean time, Todd Ogren has agreed to resurface the roadway and care for it as a gravel road. Supposedly HWY 50 will be completely redone in a few years, including a new access road to the club.

Ammo and Loading Supplies Shortage

Nobody doesn't know that we are in the midst of an ammo shortage. The most unbelievable part is the absence of .22 Cal. ammo, any and all kinds of it!! The whole situation is due to consumer hoarding that was brought on by the lawmakers attempt to ban all things "Firearm" related.

At our last couple of club meetings we discussed cutting back on the number of rounds shot in the Fall league. Most shooters seem to be happy with limiting the weekly league to one each Slow, Timed and Rapid match, or two Galleries, for a total of 60 rounds. This would still require 780 rounds for the 13 week league (about a brick and a half) per shooter.

Reloading supplies are in a similar situation, particularly regarding primers. So, we'll have to play the Winter center-fire league by ear for now. We have asked a couple of the local suppliers to call if they get in a shipment of 22 standard and/or high-velocity ammo. But in the mean time, a number of members have located ammo and provided their sources listed here:

We have asked a couple of local dealers to call should they get in a shipment of 22 ammo. However, their supplies are just trickling in. So, do your best to find ammo and perhaps share it with someone who is totally out.

CCW Training Policy Reminders

A number of members are providing firearms safety classes for concealed carry weapons training. Please remember:

- CCW programs may not interfere with member access to the range. **Note: NRA courses do have priority over member access.**
- All participants must sign the Release and Indemnification form.
- A \$10.00 fee is required from participants using the range for live fire exercises.
- Guns introduced to the shooting line must be unloaded and in a case. Muzzles must remain pointed down-range at all times.
- Use of ECU's (empty chamber indicators) is required.
- No shooting from in front of the yellow line. **Note: an adjustable-height target holder may be placed at mid-range. To minimize damage to the plywood back splash panels, please use lanes #1 and #10 for CCW exercises.**
- No "quick draw," "shooting from the hip" or "spray and pray."
- No human images or human-like silhouette targets may be posted.
- More than 5 shooters requires additional range safety officers.
- All other range restrictions and maintenance activities apply.

Annual Maintenance Party Saturday, Sept. 7, 2013, 8:00 AM

Club Maintenance Chairman, John Munoz, is coordinating an annual maintenance party for the first Saturday in September. With specific assignments listed, he will be calling the members with particular talents and tools to get the projects completed in one 4-hour shift.

RANGE SAFETY POLICY

Legally carried Personal Protection weapons must remain holstered or concealed at all times. All other firearms brought into the range must be unloaded and cased. All firearm handling and usage is restricted by posted rules as enforced by the Range Safety Officer.

MEMBERSHIP

SOUTHPORT GUN CLUB, INC., AKA "SOUTHPORT MASTERS," is a not-for-profit organization. We are a private club that supports and promotes indoor rifle and handgun shooting sports.

The club conducts business meetings on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 7:00 PM, at 7401-75th St., Kenosha, WI.

For insurance reasons, all members must also be National Rifle Association members.

New member candidates are sponsored by an existing club member. Applicants are interviewed by the members present at their first monthly meeting. Candidates must attend a second meeting for initiation and training. All members are expected to participate in range operations and maintenance.

Everyone using the range (shooters and spectators) must know the safety rules and sign a Release and Indemnification Form.

FEES

An initiation fee of \$70.00 is required to activate new memberships. (Includes electronic entry key). Regular dues are \$20.00 per month. Senior dues, age 75 or older, are \$5.00 per month. The first three months must also be paid by new members. Dues are paid on a quarterly, semi-annual or annual basis.

GUESTS

Members may chaperone guests to the range at their convenience at \$10.00 per visit. Guest shooters are allowed three shooting visits and should seek membership for continued range use. Members are responsible for the safety and conduct of their guests.

FACILITIES

SOUTHPORT offers an official 50 foot indoor range with pneumatically controlled turning targets. The range has 10 firing lanes with overhead and floor mounted lights for target illumination.

Only .22 cal. rimfire rifles and 22 cal. rimfire, 25, 32, 380, 38 spl, 38 Super, 9mm, 40 S&W, 44 spl. and 45 cal. handguns allowed on range. Centerfire loads are limited to 450 ft.-lb. muzzle energy.

A computer entry system logs in all range users. Member access is preempted during scheduled leagues and competitions.

10 mm, 357 SIG, ALL MAGNUM, CASULL, SHOTGUN SLUGS AND ALL SHOT LOADS ARE STRICTLY FORBIDDEN

HISTORY

SOUTHPORT was conceived, funded and constructed in 1954 by local shooters.

The vitality of the range is directly related to our diverse membership and their enthusiasm toward its success. We pride ourselves in being good neighbors and contribute to the community by running firearms safety and Wisconsin DNR hunter education training programs.

The range is designed for official Conventional Indoor Pistol "Bullseye" shooting, where competitors use one hand in the off-hand standing position. Matches includes three courses of fire, Slow, Timed and Rapid. Although traditionalists shoot strictly iron sights, telescopic sights are permitted in Bullseye. Many advanced shooters use electronic illusion (red dot) type sights.

In addition to membership fees, the club derives income by sponsoring NRA sanctioned competitions. Members provide manpower to manage .22 Cal. SECTIONALS and centerfire STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Precision rimfire rifle and air gun leagues and competitions are also set up from time to time. For airguns, the range facilitates hanging targets at the official 10 meter (33 ft.) distance.

ALL NATIONAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION MEMBERS ARE WELCOME TO PARTICIPATE IN CLUB LEAGUES AND MATCHES

PISTOL LEAGUES

SOUTHPORT sponsors two pistol leagues each year. The FALL RIMFIRE LEAGUE runs from mid-September through mid-December. Participants shoot 90 rounds each week.

Revolvers or semi-autos are permitted. Most shooters choose semi-auto target models. Four matches are run each week, consisting of:

SLOW FIRE - two targets, 10 rounds each, shot in 10 minutes each.

GALLERY, also called National Match Course, (NMC) - three targets, one each SLOW, TIMED and RAPID, for a total of 30 rounds.

TIMED FIRE - two targets, each shot with two strings of 5 rounds in 20 seconds.

RAPID FIRE - two targets, each shot with two strings of 5 rounds in 10 seconds.

The WINTER CENTERFIRE LEAGUE begins in January and runs approximately 13 weeks. It consists of two galleries, (10 rounds each of SLOW, TIMED AND RAPID fire) - one rimfire gallery and one centerfire gallery.

Centerfire revolvers and pistols are limited to the ammo and loads listed under "FACILITIES" in the column to the left.

The range features automatically turned targets at the 50 foot mark. Firing cadence is called by a range officer (usually a participating club member) as prescribed in the NRA rules.

Participants score each other's target. Each target holds a possible 100 point score. Very few shooters ever get a perfect score. Handicaps are calculated for league scores.

Leagues are funded separately by and for the benefit of participants. League fees include targets, awards and banquet.

PISTOL MATCHES

The club generally sponsors two handgun competitions each year. Both are NRA sanctioned and NRA membership is required for all participants.

The January Sectional is a .22 cal. RIMFIRE event. 90 rounds are shot as described in FALL RIMFIRE LEAGUE.

Team matches are often included for additional awards. This adds another 30 round gallery making the entire event 120 rounds.

SOUTHPORT usually sponsors the Wisconsin State Indoor Pistol Championships. Also called "1800's," these shoots include 90 rounds of rimfire and 90 rounds of centerfire. Possible perfect score is 1800 points. Official individual NRA indoor classifications apply for sanctioned competitions.

League and match fees run from \$30.00 for members to \$100.00 for non-members.

RIMFIRE RIFLE LEAGUE

SOUTHPORT sponsors the S.E. WISCONSIN RIFLE ASSOCIATION team on Thursdays during the Fall and Winter season. Competitors shoot here and at the range in Waukesha.

The league fee is \$5.00 per weekly match. (Non-Southport Members pay \$7.00 when shooting in Kenosha).

The course of fire includes 10 rounds each in prone, sitting, kneeling and standing positions. 10 minutes are allowed in prone and sitting, 15 minutes in kneeling and standing.

The team is looking for new shooters, especially young people, to join them. For more information contact "Boots" Obermeyer, (262) 843-3537 in Bristol or Bill Frost, (847) 482-0479 in Lake Bluff, IL.

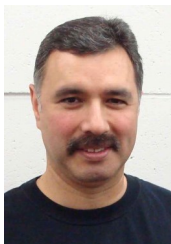
