DAY 1: Sunday, November 25, 2018

Fly to Lima

DAY 2: Monday, November 26

Professional Interaction

Please Note: Breakfast is included daily at your hotel.

Professional members will spend the day meeting with your Peruvian counterparts. Begin your program with a meeting with the **Peruvian Library Association** (or similar) to discuss Peru's library system and services and the role the association plays within that system.

Continue this afternoon with a visit to a local university library, such as the **Catholic University of Lima,** to meet with their Graduate School of Library Management to learn about the major innovations and challenges facing their faculty.

Mission of the program: This primary objective for this trip is for U.S. librarians is to explore Peru's libraries to get a better understanding of their successes in meeting their specific missions; any innovations they have developed; the major challenges/issues they are dealing with in their libraries; and to identify potential collaboration/partnerships.

Guest program

Today accompanying guests will explore Peru's capital, a rich kaleidoscope of colonial architecture, revered pre-Columbian sites, charming residential areas, and vibrant shopping districts perched over the blue Pacific. See the 16th century **Plaza Mayor** (main square) still graced by the government palace, city hall and a cathedral. Continue on to see the San Francisco Convent, built in the 17th century, and its "catacombs" that functioned as an ancient underground cemetery. The tour continues along the city's lovely Pacific coast through the enchanting neighborhoods of San Isidro, Miraflores and Larco Mar. Discover colonial art in the Barbosa-Stern Collection. Since 1966, Eduardo Barbosa and his wife Silvia Stern have collected an impressive compilation of Spanish colonial art.

Lunch will be provided this afternoon. Your welcome dinner is at a local restaurant.

DAY 3: Tuesday, November 27

Morning Cultural Exploration & Afternoon Professional Meeting

Start your day with a curator-guided tour of the unique **Larco Museum**. Gain insight into 3,000 years of Peru's cultural history viewing a vast array of artifacts that comprise the largest private collection of pre-Columbian art in the world. Enjoy lunch at the onsite Café del Museuo.

This afternoon, continue your professional exploration with a visit to a public library such as the **Biblioteca Municipal de Lima** (Municipal Library of Peru). Tour the library and meet with representatives to continue your discussions around the role librarians play in promoting literacy among the populace.

Guest program

This afternoon, guests will take a stroll around Barranco, considered to be the city's most romantic and bohemian, being the home and working place of many of Peru's leading artists, musicians, designers and photographers. In the 19th-century, it was a very fashionable beach resort for the Limeño aristocracy, and many people used to spend the summer here. While there visit the Pedro de Osma Museum which exhibits Peruvian artistic pieces from the fifth to the eighteenth century. Paintings from the eighteenthcentury Cuzco school are among the highlighted pieces of the viceregal art collection.

DAY 4: Wednesday, November 28

Fly to Cusco

Immediately after breakfast, depart the hotel for your flight to **Cusco**. Elevated approximately 11,100 feet above sea level, Cusco is a World Heritage Site and the former capital of the Inca Empire. Lunch will be provided at a local restaurant after arrival before hotel check-in.


Altitude Sickness - We recommend you check with your personal physician to see if an altitude sickness medication is right for you. *Those who live at sea level or a lower elevation should pay particular attention.*

Aranwa Cusco Boutique Hotel is the essence of luxury and comfort in the heart of the Inca city. Built in a colonial mansion of the XVI century, it displays several paintings of the Cuzco school, colonial sculptures and carvings that transport us to the greatness of the time. The elegant rooms are equipped with intelligent oxygen system and heating floor in the bathrooms for a great stay.

Enjoy some time to rest and acclimate this afternoon before heading out on an exploration of the Imperial City. Stroll through the **Main Square**, where you will see the Cathedral and admire its exquisite vestibules and priceless paintings from the Cusco School of the 17th and 18th centuries. Continue on to see **Qoricancha** (the Golden Temple), dedicated to the worship of the Sun God, whose interior walls were said to have been covered in gold.

Dinner will be provided at Inka Grill Restaurant.

DAY 5: Thursday, November 29

Professional Program

Continue your professional exchange today with plans to visit a university library such as the **National University of Saint Anthony the Abbot in Cuzco** as well as a public library such as **Biblioteca Publica de Cuzco**.

One of the biggest advantages to international travel includes bridging the educational and cultural gap between information professionals. Continue discussions around some of the innovations happening in the field and the status of information technology in Peruvian libraries and to what extent IT is implemented.

Lunch & dinner will be provided today.

Guest program

Today, guests will enjoy a mix of past and present, beginning with the Cementerio General de la Almudena in Cusco (Almudena Cemetery), where Catholic beliefs syncretize with Andean cosmovision, indicative of true Cusco culture. Built in 1845, the cemetery preserves a part of the city's history from the Republican era and shows artistic representations of that period's cultural imagination. Next, explore the San Pedro Market, Cusco's main street market, inundated with aromas, tastes, sights, and colors of the local products of the Cusco region. To complete the day, discover Sacsayhuaman, a colossal structure of enormous stones, carved and fitted together with incredible precision. At this Inca archaeological site, we will have a beautiful overlook views of the city of Cusco.

DAY 6: Friday, November 30

Explore Machu Picchu

Please note: Today's itinerary includes moderate physical activity with some low-difficulty hiking.

Take the *Vistadome* train to **Machu Picchu** this morning. During the journey, see the hanging bridge that signals the start of the Inca Trail, following the course of the Urubamba (or Vilcanota) River climbing down a canyon headed to Aguas Calientes. Continue from there to board the mini-buses up to the remnants of the Sacred Citadel of the Incas.

Enjoy your **privately-guided tour of the archaeological ruins of Machu Picchu** early this morning. Known as one of the most beautiful and enigmatic ancient sites in the world, the Andean mountaintop was used by the Inca people as the foundation of hundreds of stone structures, with construction starting in the early 1400s. Explore the terraces, corridors, temples, the solar clock (*Intihuatana*), and other sacred places within the citadel. Lunch will be provided at the Sanctuary Lodge after your morning tour and lecture with your guide.

Stop at the **central market** to peruse for local souvenirs near the train station.

Take the train back to Cusco late this afternoon where you will check back into your Cusco hotel and have time for a late dinner on your own arrangement. *Food and beverage options will also be available for purchase on the train.*

Lunch will be on your own arrangement after you are dropped off at the hotel for some time to explore on your own. Your well-located hotel will make exploring the neighborhood very easy. The hotel is located near Regocijo Square, 2 blocks from the Main Square of Cusco.

Say goodbye as you reflect and share memories over a farewell dinner and show at the Tunupa Restaurant. Enjoy a Pisco Sour drink this evening as you celebrate the end of what we believe will be a fantastic program and the chance to make some new friends.!

*We recommend you pack your bags and settle your incidental expenses as you will depart early the following morning for the airport for your flight back to Lima and onward to the U.S.
