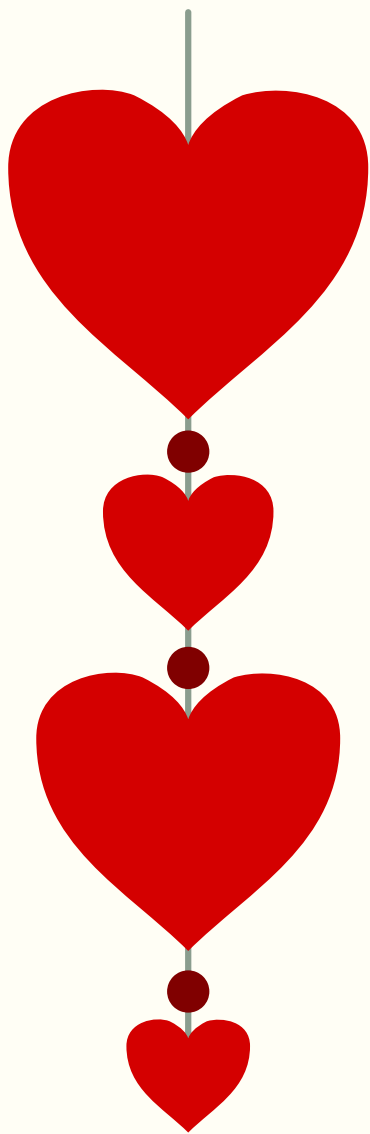

“The Israelites bewailed Moses in the plains for 30 days; then the days of tearful mourning for Moses ended.”

Joshua son of Nun was filled with spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands upon him, so the children of Israel obeyed him and did as Hashem commanded Moses.”
Deuteronomy 34:8-9 In the above, upon the death of Moses, Joshua ably takes over the functions of leading the Israelites, in the Talmud a different version is presented. Prior to his death, Moses said to Joshua, “Tell me your doubts.” Joshua said: “Have I ever left you and gone to another place?” In the immediate, Joshua forgot 300 laws, and 700 doubts appeared to him. Hashem said: “It is impossible for me to tell you.” Babylonian Talmud, TEMURAH 16A.

In the natural course of change

doubts are part of the process. Joshua knew that he could not be Moses. He needed to differentiate himself from Moses and be himself. To do this he surely reviewed Moses ideas and rules. He thought about G-d and his everlasting belief in him.

Because of this, many people were angry with him. A review of these doubt and reasons are why he saw the way to become the outstanding leader that all Israel needed. We should learn from his examples of leadership in both armed battle and peace.

A favorite example of mine is that of new plants. In a few months they will be here, and with the spring time growing through layers of old branches, and leaves. The new plants will break through the plants that nourished them in winter in order that they may proceed with their own lives. We must realize that first as the plants, we too must break away from old patterns. Concisely, our parents, teachers, and ancestors matter; but we and Beth Shalom must face the future with the resolve that we will grow and flourish together on our own.

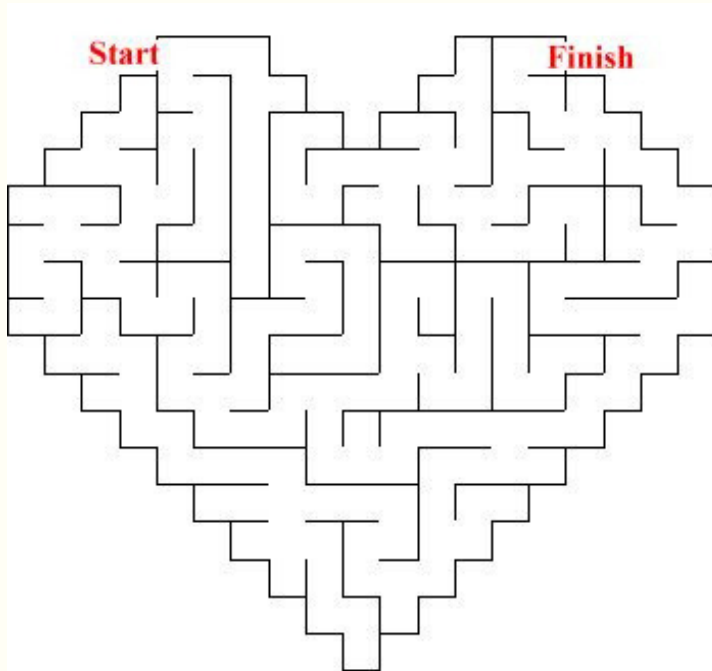

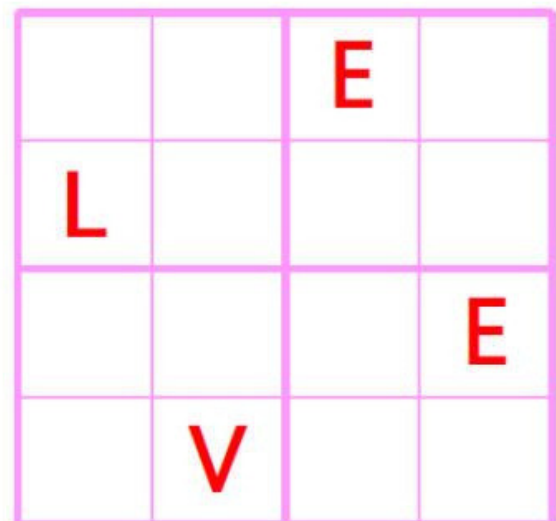
