Programs - Ghana

Soroptimist Supports Educating Girls in Ghana

As you may know, Soroptimist International of Grosse Pointe (SIGP) is a global volunteer organization working to improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment. For the past three years Soroptimist has raised money to send six girls to St. Anne High School in Damongo, Ghana, Africa. What is Soroptimist's connection to Ghana, Africa? It's Carol Hofer, a current member of SIGP! When Carol was in her 20's, she was a Peace Corps volunteer in Ghana, and now, 40 years later, Carol still stays in contact with the village that she worked in. Bishop Peter Paul Angkyler who is the Bishop of Damongo came to the United States in July to raise money for his parish and St. Anne High School. While in Michigan, he was the guest of Carol and had an evening meeting Soroptimists. Here is his quote about the necessity of educating girls in Ghana: "So I like to use this opportunity to acknowl-

edge with deep gratitude the help that your group is giving toward the formation of our girls in the St. Anne School in Damongo,

Ghana. Sometimes we do not see the great support that this help is bringing to our girls. But in the context of Damongo where the girl child education is not given much value, and the Church in her efforts to give witness, to let the society become more conscious and to become more committed to this forming our young people into leadership, whatever little help we get is very significant. And at the moment, **these** girls who have been supported, I can say clearly and firmly that without this support they would not have been able to go to school. And therefore, on their behalf and on behalf of their families, to thank each and every person who contributes toward their formation and to know that it is an investment which is worthwhile. Those will see the development of the girls so far and their response, you see that already there

is a significant transformation in terms of leadership and the joy with which they carry out their studies. I visit the girls from time to time and very often I marvel really at their gifts and I just think about how these gifts would have been lost to Church and to society if people were not supportive of them. So on this note, I would like to say THANK YOU and to encourage... let us together see what we can do to help this and as the great educationalist (Dr. James Emmanuel Kwegyir-Aggrey, 1875-1927) one time said' **"If you edu-**

cate a man, you educate an individual, but if you educate a woman, you educate a nation." This is great wisdom and I see it because mothers, women, have a significant role in the family and especially in our context where how many mothers have to struggle in different ways to help their children. And if these young women are educated and have leadership they certainly will be able to bring about greater transformation and in society. God help each and everyone and blessings to all of you."

Monthly Newsletter: August

Thank you for your continual interest in Elli's House! Elli's House is a religious organization affiliated with the Michigan District - Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. Our mission is to provide temporary shelter for runaway, homeless, or young girls involved in sex trafficking, in the city of Detroit, with family reunification as our primary goal.

"Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy" - Proverbs 31:9 **Updates:**

Our first house clean up was a HUGE success! Thank you to all the volunteers who sacrificed their Saturday to help! We are still amazed at the progress that was made that day. We were humbled by all the friends, family, acquaintances, and strangers that showed up to help that day. Our next work day will be Saturday, August 26, 9-3 pm. When you sign up, please include your email address in the notes section in order to receive the waiver. Once you are signed up, a waiver will sent and you can email the completed form to ellishouse313@yahoo.com.

Our street outreach teams have been very busy and we are looking into expanding our outreach area with other teams. If you are interested in learning more, contact Deb atellishouse313@yahoo.com. You can also follow our outreach reports on Instagram and Facebook. In case you are do not use social media, I am including our most recent report.

We made arrangements to meet with T because she was considering going to detox. She told us she was ready to go but after 40 minutes of phone calls, she became frustrated, irritated and refused to go. We prayed with her and gave her food with a hygiene kit and drove away.

As soon as we pulled down the next street, we ran into our friend N. She is a women we have talked to several times in the last month. With tears flowing from her eyes, she said, "I've been waiting for my people." (She was talking about us) She continued, "I've been praying lately, and I know I need to leave the streets. I am so tired and scared." N told us how scared she was since she heard about several girls getting raped and killed in the last several weeks. She had been storing up her few belongings and sleeping in an abandoned car behind the local automotive store. While we were talking with N, a man pulled up and began talking to her. She quickly told him to leave and said she was ready to leave.

After a few phone calls, we were able to get her a bed in a rehab/detox clinic. We drove her to the clinic and sat with her as she went through the long intake process. After intake, we stood out in the rain so she could smoke her last cigarette. After hugging and praying, we watched our brave, courageous friend take the first step to a new life.

While at the rehab clinic, we made a great connection with the Intake Coordinator, who gave us direct line to call him when we have girls that need drug detox and rehab. He assured me they would get them in. Please continue to pray that N will have the strength to stay for the entire program and we will be able to help her with the next steps.

We are currently looking for monthly and business donors. If you know anyone who would be interested in helping, please email Deb.

We are working on getting a privacy fence and security system donated. We want to keep the building secure as we start bringing materials and possessions into the house. If you have any contacts for fence companies or security systems, please contact Deb.




