Return From the War For Those Who Never Made It Back

My Grandad Phil Rasile was a WW2 combat vet, and when we were very small children he told us a few war stories so that we might have gratitude and appreciation for our freedoms in America. He was never harmed in the war, outside of the anguish of seeing his friends die ruthlessly. He was an *Infantryman* with a .30 caliber tripod machine gun that successfully warded off the Germans in Italy. Yes, my Grandad made it home, thank God, but many of his friends and nearly 1.6 million others were killed or became WW2-POW's... they never made it back.
