



From the President's Desk

Here we are rushing into February – the month of hearts and love is in the air! Our General Meeting (February 2<sup>nd</sup>) and program "The Fine Art of Lithography" will showcase many romantic works by Pierre Auguste Renoir. Then on the evening of February 12<sup>th</sup> the Club will hold a Valentine Masquerade Party. Details and reservation information for these events are on the next page of this newsletter.

February brings us the first kick-off event for Fiesta 2022 – our Fiesta Teen Queen Coronation on February 27<sup>th</sup>. The Coronation will be held at McAllister Auditorium on the campus of our neighbor, San Antonio College, with a reception to follow at our 1717 San Pedro home.

Each year as Fiesta approaches, it brings excitement to our city. The first Fiesta celebration began in 1891 in front of the Alamo. The idea was conceived by Ellen Maury Slayden, wife of Congressman James L Slayden, as an April 21 salute to honor the men who fought in battles across Texas including the battles of the Alamo and San Jacinto. For their event Mrs. Slayden and friends had set up food booths and organized a parade where all the bicycles, horses and carriages were decorated with real flowers. They set the date of the first parade for April 20<sup>th</sup> to accommodate the schedule of visiting President Benjamin Harrison. The President arrived in San Antonio by train and was set to give a speech in front of the Alamo as part of the festivities.

But on April 20<sup>th</sup>, 1891, the skies opened and it poured down rain. Unfortunately, the President was on a schedule and had to leave before it stopped raining. Besides, the streets were too muddy for a parade. After four days and the arrival of fair weather, the ladies decided to go ahead with the festivities. The flowers on the carriages and bikes were looking rather tired. As the parade progressed around Alamo Plaza, the flowers fell off and landed on the street. The crowd was in a good mood, so they picked up the flowers and began throwing them at each other. And that my friends is how the group of women inspired by Ellen Slayden became the *Battle* of Flowers Association and the annual Parade and Fiesta San Antonio were born.

Today, Fiesta includes a tradition of handsome medals for all. Our 2022 medal is a true salute to our long connection with and participation in this wonderful San Antonio tradition.

## February 2 - "The Fine Art of Lithography"

Madame Marie-Paule Renoir, widow of the grandson of the famous Impressionist artist Pierre Auguste Renoir, inherited the right to place the embossed seal to sign his name on any of his artwork. Madame Renoir and her daughter, Nathalie, are bringing a program on the Fine Art of Lithography to the Woman's Club. With this program they will be sharing some rare Renoir family photos and hand pulled lithographs for display. Lithography is a word from the Greek – loosely – stone writing. It is a printing method based on the chemistry that oil and water do not mix. In 1796 German author, Alois Senefelder, developed a method of printing using a metal plate with a smooth surface. Lithography can be used to print text or images onto paper or other suitable material.


