THE **BAPTISM OF THE LORD** Looking at the events of Christ's baptism

several curious

thoughts come to mind. First of all is that Jesus didn't need to be baptized at all. This said, Christian people realized from an early point what happened: On the one hand, immersion into the waters is a symbol of death, which recalls the symbolism of the annihilating, destructive power of the ocean flood. The ancient mind perceived the ocean as a permanent threat to the cosmos, to the earth; it was the primeval flood that might submerge all life . . . But the flowing waters of the river are above all a symbol of life. Jesus loaded the burden of all mankind's guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public ministry by stepping into the place of sinners. His baptism is an acceptance of death for the sins of humanity, but the voice that calls out "This is my beloved Son" over the baptismal waters is a anticipatory reference to the Resurrection. This also explains why, in his own discourses, Jesus uses the word "baptism" to refer to his death. Leave us not forget however that He is the life.



PRAYER IS GOD'S GIFT

"Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." But when we pray, do we speak

from the height of our pride and will, or "out of the depths" of a humble and contrite heart?

He who humbles himself will be exalted; humility is the foundation of prayer. Only when we humbly acknowledge that "we do not know how to pray as we ought," are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer.

"Man is a beggar before God." "If you knew the gift of God!" The wonder of prayer is revealed beside the well where we come seeking water: there, Christ comes to meet every human being. It is he who first seeks us and asks us for a drink. Jesus thirsts; his asking arises from the depths of God's desire for us. Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours. God thirsts that we may thirst for him. "You would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." Paradoxically our prayer of petition is a response to the plea of the living God: "They have forsaken me, the fountain of living waters, and hewn out cisterns for themselves, broken cisterns that can hold no water!" Prayer is the response of faith to the free promise of salvation and also a response of love to the thirst of the only Son of God.


