Flooding will Impact Amana Yields

Amana Farms, like every farm on several watersheds in the state, has had to contend with flooding as July rainfalls pushed many lowa rivers into flooding. The lowa River here in Amana is expected to crest here in Amana on Thursday, August 7.

The Iowa River has been flooding for about two weeks, but as of Monday, August 4, the Army Corps of Engineers believes it will crest at 17.6 feet in Marengo at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, August 6. This is about 1 and ½ feet below what is termed as major flooding at 19 feet. The Iowa River achieved an all-time high crest of 21 feet, 4 inches on June 12, 2008.

We checked in with Amana Farms General Manager John McGrath as to the extent of crop damage here on the farm.

McGrath reported, "Our crops, pastures and hay fields have looked very good all year due to ample rains. The latest batch of rain that has fallen here and also further upstream in the watershed has finally put things 'over the top' and we are/will experience crop losses that will be significant. In all likelihood, we will have over 500 acres of zero yield and more area surrounding the flooded area that will be negatively impacted."

He added that in addition to the areas flooded by river water, there are low-lying areas that have been drowned by too much water locally such as water logged pockets in the fields south of the village of Amana.

The impacted acres are mostly corn. "But at least one small field of soybeans will be nearly a complete loss," McGrath said.

Iowa River Reports

Checking with the U.S. Geological Survey data and reports on lowa River flooding here is what we gleaned.

The Iowa River above Coralville dam has been high for several weeks. From July 25 – July 30 the pool level (Coralville lake level) has hovered at 684 feet. The normal pool level at this time is 683 feet. Beginning on July 31 at 1p.m. the pool began to rise more rapidly and as of August 4 it was reported at 685 feet and rising.

According to the forecasts of the Army Corps of Engineers, Rock Island Division, the Coralville Lake pool is expected to crest at 688 feet plus a few inches on Sunday, August 10. If no more rain falls in the watershed. If more rain falls this projection must be revised.

Impacts to the area begin to be most noticeable at 689 feet when the Sandy Beach Road must be closed. At 700 feet the Amana Road (back road to East Amana) and 140th are closed. The pool level must reach 712 feet to overtop the spillway so



clearly we are not in any danger of that happening at this time.

According to the Coralville Lake Forecast dated August 4, beginning since before August 1 the amount of water released at the dam has been 10,000 cubic feet per second. From August 1 until (as projected) August 9 more water will be flowing into the dam than will be released. On August 10, if no more rain falls, the water inflow and outflow levels will be equal and then outflow will begin to exceed inflow. Ten thousand cubic feet per second (cfs) will be released until August 13 when the amount being released will be slowed to 8,000 cfs with a gradual step down to take place through August 17. By August 17 the amount released will be at about 4,000. Inflow is expected to gradually recede to 3,700 feet by August 17. So for about 7 to 8 days outflow will exceed inflow in order to draw down the pool and return it to normal levels.

During nonflood or normal conditions in July the Coralville dam releases about the same amount of water it takes in, according the US Army Corps of Engineers report on Coraville operations.

The Iowa River at Marengo is considered to be in moderate flood stage now. As of Monday, August 1 it was measured at 17.28 feet with the expected crest to arrive on Wednesday August 6. In Marengo 19 feet is considered "major flood stage." At 19 feet homes on the west of Marengo are impacted by floodwaters. The all time record crest was over 21 feet in 2008.
