# Our Youth Group is going to New Orleans in July of 2024 for the National Youth Gathering.



## Here is how you can help them on their journey.

We have six youth and two adult leaders heading to New Orleans in July of 2024 for the National Youth Gathering. This is a time for our youth to grow in their faith and as an overall youth group. You will see the youth active in different ways throughout the year and we ask that you help us get to New Orleans.

We need to raise about \$9,000 for everyone and we cannot do it without the gracious help of our St. Paul's family. In the atrium is a yellow bulletin board with 8 airplane seats, 8 hotel beds, and 8 plates broken into 3 pieces so you can see the progress as we get ready for this adventure. You can help in a variety of ways, including purchasing a whole airplane seat or hotel bed, or if you can just help with a meal for someone.

How to "purchase" a specific item is broken down:

- ▶ 1 airplane seat cost \$400 (this is for roundtrip)
- ▶ 1 hotel bed cost \$350 (this is for the entire week)
- ▶ 1 meal costs \$25 or a whole day of meals costs \$75 (this is for 1 person)

As we raise funds, watch the airplane take off from RDU (Durham, NC) to MSY (New Orleans, LA).

Donations can be made online through the church website (under the giving online option) or during the offering time in service. Please note on your donation (Youth Gathering – purchase item" (i.e. "Youth Gathering - airplane seat" or "Youth Gathering - 1 meal").


