There are typically 40 - 50 patrols from troops all over Chester County attending to demonstrate their First Aid skills in a competition which will include multiple choice and fill in the blank paper tests. Then the patrols will move on to demonstrate their skills in practical first aid scenarios.

Scouts will be given a situation in which injuries resulted and then they must demonstrate how to care for the injured. All patrols will be scored on their performance in four such scenarios. The winners will then be announced.

Troop 78 patrols have been practicing their first aid skills for the past several meetings and will continue to practice throughout January. Summer Camp 2020

SUMMER CAMP REGISTRATION IS NOW UNDERWAY!

Are you tired of winter; the cold and the snow? Are you looking forward to warm sunny days and camping under the stars? Are you looking forward to summer camp since we left last July? Me too. Once again Troop 78 has reserved the Dan Beard campsite at Camp Horseshoe for two weeks:

Week One starts on Sunday, June 21st and ends on June 28th Week Two begins on Sunday, June 28th and ends on July 5th

Troop 78 Scouts learn many skills for rank advancement, hundreds of merit badges, and display their teamwork, skills, and Scout spirit in the many games and contests at camp. The basis for our Scouting program is camping, and this two-week period is always the highlight of our Scouting year. Your troop committee and leadership would like to have 100% of the troop in camp this summer. We are encouraging 2nd year and up campers to stay for two weeks.

The cost this year is \$420.00 per week if paid in full by March 27th, (\$475 per week after that).

A \$50 deposit per week is due by February 14th.

Please indicate which week you are registering for on the deposit payment form found on the troop website.

Again this year, there is a Multi-Scout Family Discount. Families with more than one scout attending camp with the troop pays the entire fee for Scout one; the entire fee less \$50 for each additional scout each week.

You will receive a free troop T-shirt if you pay in full by March 27th and turn in your completed health/medical form to the troop by May 15th.

The health/medical form is on the troop website, and must be less than one calendar year old for the entire time you are at camp. The BSA has updated the Health/Medical Form this year, so make sure to download the most recent form from the Troop 78 website or from the Camp Horseshoe website. Please make sure the completed health/medical form includes parts A, B & C (part C is a pre-participation physical and requires a physician's signature) with a front and back copy of your medical insurance card.









If your scout has special dietary needs or needs to take medication while at camp, a Special Dietary Form and Medication Form are also required and submitted along with the health/medical form by May 15th (forms are available on the Troop website and Camp Horseshoe website).

If you wish to use scout account funds to pay for summer camp, please contact Joe Cady at jcadyjr@gmail.com. Joe can provide the current scout account balance and you can instruct him on the amount you would like to use for summer camp.

Note: due to required due date changes from Chester County Council for summer camp this year, the due dates for payments and forms have changed and are earlier than in prior years.
