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Mrs. Matyasovsky called for a motion to accept the Workers Comp renewal in the amount of \$ 47, 758.00, effective January 1, 2020. Mrs. Weigand made the motion, seconded by Mr. Matlos and passed unanimously.

Mrs. Matyasovsky presented the 2020 proposed budgets, as follows:

a. General Fund: \$ 1,082,790
b. Sewer Fund: \$ 540,000
c. Highway Fund: \$ 83,550
d. Sinking Fund: \$ 71,000

Mr. Matlos made a motion to adopt the 2020 proposed budgets, and to advertise and post for public inspection for 10 days. The motion was seconded by Mr. Sloss and passed unanimously. Mrs. Matyasovsky said the proposed General Fund budget does not include a tax increase.

Mrs. Matyasovsky presented Resolution No. 2019-06, appointing Robert J. Tomasic, CPA to make an independent examination of the accounting records for the fiscal year 2019, and to perform other duties and exercise such other powers as conferred by statute. Mr. Ponchak made a motion to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Mr. Matlos and passed unanimously.

## PERSONNEL. Mrs. Matyasovsky, Chairman, reporting.

Mrs. Matyasovsky stated that three (3) council members were leaving Chris Ponchak, Melissa Morgan and Jane Weigand. She presented them with plaques and thanked them for their years of hard work.

## STREETS & SEWERS. Mr. Zrenchak, Chairman, reporting.

Mr. Zrenchak stated that the auto dialer for the pump station needs updated, we have no choice but to do it. He said that he is looking into doing so.

#### SOLICITOR RACUNAS'S REPORT.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Ordinance 2019-06, for handicap parking. The motion was made by Mr. Ponchak, seconded by Mrs. Weigand and passed unanimously.

#### ENGINEER GLENN'S REPORT.

Mr. Glenn wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

Mr. Glenn was notified by the Allegheny County Department of Development that they do not recognize our legal newspaper to advertise in for the generator project for the fire department, he stated that the bids were rejected. At this time Mr. Glenn asked for council to make a motion to reject the bids and re-advertise for the generator project for the fire department. The motion was made by Mr. Ponchak, seconded by Mr. Matlos and passed unanimously.

Mr. Glenn stated that we are requesting a DCED grant to renew the pump station along River Road in the amount of \$419,550.00 from the Commonwealth Financing Authority and designating Donald M. Glenn and Melissa Morgan as the officials to execute all documents between the Borough of Liberty and Commonwealth Financing Authority. Mr. Glenn asked for council to make a motion to ratify the Resolution that was passed on November 13, 2019 for this grant. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mrs. Weigand and passed unanimously.

Mr. Ponchak called for a motion to accept typed minutes from the Regular Session on November 13, 2019. The motion was made by Mrs. Weigand, seconded by Mr. Sloss, and passed unanimously.

The next meeting dates and times will be set at reorganization on Monday, January 6, 2020 at 6:15pm.

No adjournment was made; Mr. Ponchak stated that this meeting will continue on Thursday, December 26, 2019 at 4pm.

The above borough business concluded at 7:53pm.
