Committee members need to: attend planning meetings leading up to the event; collaborate with others to create the events, share ideas for improving, assist with planning and event details; volunteer during the event/ and or help recruit volunteers.

News & Notes from page 1 Birds of a Feather

Whether it was due to low water in traditional central flyway lakes and ponds, a change in our climate or a simple change of avian seasonal routine, this past week saw a huge influx of snow geese, Canada geese, trumpeter swans and other waterfowl on the Lily Lake.

The numbers, and we are guessing, ranged hourly from 300 to 3,000 birds. Guessing how many birds were on the lake became something of a game as folks gathered to watch the birds. As photos were posted on Facebook some of the birdwatchers were coming to the Lily Lake from as far away as Dubuque and Bellevue Iowa (one couple I spoke too who came to view the birds and then had lunch in Amana.)

There are more than 60 species of waterfowl in North American and it felt as if at least 25 were on the lake, but prominently visible were the snow geese and trumpeters who stand out on the water. Pelicans, are not classed as waterfowl as they have their own species agrouping. It appeared that these were the white American Pelicans which are, as the name suggests, common to our area. The pelicans are nearly as large as trumpeter swans but have the longer bill and tend to soar and circle in large groups. They don't appear to fly so much as to float along on streams of air. Evening and morning the pelicans headed to fields as far away as West Amana and South Amana to feed.
