DOG ATTACK IN DELAFIELD

On Monday, August 3rd, around 7:30 p.m. a Delafield resident, Kris and her son were walking their 15 pound dog Molly, on Veterans Trail in Delafi3eld near the St. John's Northwestern Academy golf course. Another woman walking two medium sized lab mixes(one black, the other yellow) failed to control her two dogs, who attacked Kris' little pooch. The attack was savage, lasting 3—4 minutes. Kris and her son were bitten, and their dog badly injured. The incompetent owner of the lab mixes refused to give her contact information. She is described as a white female with brown hair, wearing black shorts and a blue shirt. The Delafield Police are looking for this woman. If you have any info or know who she might be, please contact them. Molly is still in recovery from this attck.

CLASS EVALUATION HIGHLIGHTS

Summer Obedience Session 2021

Club members/students have spoken,and they were very pleased with the summer session classes. Thanks to all who fillede out the evaluation forms. Your input provides the Board with valuable feedback about our obedience program

Students appreciate a well structured, well-planned class experience. They like variety and innovation in teaching the skills and exercises, along with helpful, precise, practical training tips. Students want instructors who are well prepared and organized. Not just teaching by the seat of their pants. They enjoy our smaller class sizes with individual attention given when possible, and instructors who respect their students andhave patience when they struggle. They like instructors who are upbeat along with fellow students who are fun to be with in class. The presence of an assistant is appreciated, as are the handouts some instructors provide to help those students who actually practice at home. Our classes provide an excellent training environmment as an alternative to home training.

What would students like tosee added to or changed in our program? How about training outside at times—on both pavement (parking lot) or on grass? The square fenced grass area is available to our upcoming fall instructors. (High heat, dew ponts, rain, asthma and allergy concerns make it difficult to polan outdoor lessons.) Students would appreciate more help with competition like conditions in exercises. They really dislike down time during class—no standing around due to a lack of a clear lesson plan by the instructor. They like classes that keep moving. Some want 60 minute classes instead of 45 minutes. (We do have to allow set up time between classes.)

Your board tries to listen to the views of oth instructors and students in order to continuously improve our obedience program. Filling out the class evaluation forms is one way students can express their views. Instructors can attend the instructors' meetings and bring up suggestions, questions or provlems they are experiencing. Both instructors and students can bring their concerns to any board member at any time. The WWCDTC board acts as the "Director of Training" and as such we want your feedback.
