


Street Corn Dip

- 4 cobs of cornshucked and silk removed
- 2 tbspmayo
- ½ lime
- ½ tspchili powder
- ¼ cupfresh cilantrochopped
- salt and pepper
- 4oz.feta cheese crumbles

INSTRUCTIONS



- 1. Place corn on the cob into a large stock pot of boiling water and cook cobs for 5-7 minutes or until fork tender. Drain and rinse with cold water to cool.
- 2. Use a knife or corn stripper to cut the kernels off the cob.
- 3. Break apart the long strips of kernels into smaller pieces and place into a mixing bowl.
- 4. In a mixing bowl, add mayonnaise, squeeze half a lime for the juice, chili powder, fresh cilantro leaves, and mix the dressing well. Fold in Feta Cheese Crumbles.
- 5. Season dip generously with salt and black pepper.
- 6. Cover and refrigerate corn dip until ready to serve and let flavors mingle, or alternatively, serve immediately with corn chips or tortilla chips

Meeting Minutes

NVQG August 13, 2022 Meeting

The meeting was called to order by Rose Luce at 10:03PM.

The first order of business was an update on the Napa Town and Country Fair. Chardonnay Hall has been completely filled with quilts and other hand-crafts. There have been many compliments from fair attendees, quilters, and Expo board members. The satisfaction with the quilt guild effort has led to negotiations for a repeat performance next year. The current year effort has proven to be a terrific fund-raising opportunity for the guild – not only in the fee paid by the Expo, but also in the ability of selling tickets for the Opportunity Quilt, raffle baskets, quilt-guild-provided products such as pillowcases, potholders, and Quilts-2-Share fabrics and vintage quilts. There has been a lot of good publicity for the guild in the Napa Valley Register, and the (Napa) Marketplace magazine. Members are encouraged to attend the fair either Saturday or Sunday; if there are any additional volunteers interested in working at Chardonnay Hall, there are fair passes available at the front of the room. Kelly Van Camp commented on the amount of work that has been done by Rose Luce, and members joined her in a round of applause for Rose and for other members of the guild who have contributed their time and energy to this task. The displayed quilts will be taken down on Monday between 10AM and 12 noon; quilts can be picked up from 12 noon until 4PM. Because Rose needed to supervise at the fair, Kelly Van Camp took over the conduct of themeeting.

Membership reported that there were 46 attendees, with 4 guests.

Four winners for the prize drawing offerings were picked.

Art in the Library chair Linda Feutz asked members to please retrieve their quilts that had been displayed at this year's exhibit.

BOM – one winner was selected, and next month's BOM was displayed. The fat quarters winner was also selected.

The secretary had no report.

The treasurer reported a bank balance of \$, with the comment that a second bank account had been established to accommodate the credit card processing that the guild can now offer.

Workshops VP Kelly Van Camp reminded members that next month's workshop will be conducted by Krista Lopez, demonstrating how to make jelly prints on fabric.

The cost for workshop materials is \$35.00; members need to sign up soon.

Unfortunately, the guest speaker for today's lecture had to cancel at the last minute, so it was impossible to replace him. Kelly suggested members consider attending the fair as a substitute.

October's workshop is a lecture and quilt display by SF quilter, Lorraine Woodruff-Long; members interested in additional information can visit her website:www.quiltinginthefog. Com.

Announcements: Kay O'Neill stated that in her opinion the quilt guild exhibit at the fair was far more impressive than the much larger, well-publicized quilt show in Reno.

Sandra Ellingson announced that she is selling a large amount of fabric at her home - members can call or e-mail her for additional information.

Show and tell quilts were displayed.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:40AM.
