And while we are waiting for better weather, here is a bit of trivia for you:

Frank Shumway of Shumway Marine, in Rochester, commissioned Laser designer Bruce Kirby to draw the lines of the Ideal 18 in the late 1980s. The Shumways sailed Bulleyes each winter in Florida and sought to create a boat that was safe, simple to sail, but performed well on the water. Ontario Yachts of Burlington, Ontario, built the first Ideal 18 in 1990 and has produced 285 since then. Dozens of yacht clubs in the Northeast (mostly western Long Island Sound) and Florida maintain fleets. Essex Yacht Club has nine boats, we have three, and Ed Birch owns his own boat.

Please remember that in order to sail our Ideal 18's you must be qualified and checked out by one of our sailing instructors. Please check the bulletin board in the River Room for details.

GREEN TIP OF THE MONTH

The time of year is approaching, when activity starts up around the docks and marinas. Those of us who have boats are counting the days until we can get back on the water and enjoy. But most of us know that there still is a lot to take care of until we can throw off those docking lines and set sail. Spring is the time for commissioning engines, painting, cleaning, restoring, replenishing, and whatever else needs to be done.

There is a plethora of information available to help you ensure that all these activities do not have a negative impact on our environment. In searching for useful guidelines I came across the Clean & Green Boating Program by the American Boating Association. The organization's website has an easy to navigate list of every possible tip on how to be environmentally responsible.

There are links to information on the impact of trash and marine debris, clean boating tips, how to stop the spread of aquatic nuisance species, surveys, the relationship boating and our economy, causes of pollution, health and safety...you name it, it is listed. A good source for information, and you do not even have to be a member of ABA to access it.

One article, in particular, should strike a chord with all of us who use the Connecticut River for boating. The extent of oil in North American waterways is staggering. A 2002 report found that approximately 29 million gallons of petroleum enter North American waterways each year as a result of human activities. Nearly 85 percent comes from land-based runoff, polluted rivers, airplanes, and small boats and jet skis, while less than 8 percent comes from tanker or pipeline spills. Oil exploration and extraction contribute 3 percent to that total. If you have ever seen a drip of fuel or oil fall into the water (maybe while refueling) you know that even that tiny drip creates a wide slick. In order to keep our beautiful river healthy it is critical that boaters take extra care while handling fuels and oils.
