5. Engineering Updates – SEH

a. Funding Initiatives & Cumulative Accounting — Mike Larson updated the secured funding to date; IRRRB has one million left to commit to the second phase of the project. Included in the bonding bill will be

five to eight million in funding from the PFA water infrastructure fund, leaving a four to five million gap in funding which the City/Town will borrow from the PFA drinking water revolving fund. SEH needs to update the cost estimates for the Project and then Sweeney needs to update his calculations for rates.

- b. Engineering Work Miles Jensen
 - i. January Status Report was verbal this month.
 - Environmental Review Draft Archaeological Environmental Review was approved by SPHO; now we wait for MDH approval; Heikkila inquired about federal environmental review and Jensen reported it will take about three months; Kohlstad advised this be done prior to bidding Project; this will be an additional \$7,500.00 cost for SEH in engineering fees.
 - 2. Bat Nesting Sites Tree removal tabled to Spring; no new updates; June 1st Deadline; Niemi requested guidance on flagging (what do colors of ribbons signify).
 - 3. Technical Committee Meeting was not held; Jensen will be sending out color boards of the plant & raw water pump station facilities in March
 - 4. Emergency Water Service Interconnects Agreement Status 2nd draft was sent to Biwabik PUC; Discussion took place about the interconnect that would be a 50% benefit to Biwabik and how it should be paid for; a second phase of the Project could be for the booster stations and interconnect.
 - 5. Water Appropriations Permit was sent to DNR
- 6. **Community Outreach Plan** Three informational articles were published in the East Range Times. Hello Miles,

Thank you for providing some of the additional information that was requested as part of the application for Water Appropriation Permit 2021-3551. The information provided has been reviewed. As discussed during the meeting on January 18, additional information is needed.

The WSCP provided for the City of Biwabik does not contain the level of detail necessary to ensure protection of their public water supply. The plan should describe the minimum water elevation at which the City of Biwabik's water supply can operate. Was this information not provided as part of the Biwabik Appropriations Permit application? I'm guessing it would show up on the City's (Cleveland Cliffs') plans completed by Barr. SEH will reach out to the City to see if this information is available. Additionally, the plan should include target elevations for the Embarrass Pit which will trigger action by the ERWB. Target elevations should be selected such that they allow appropriate lead time for the associated action based on predictions of water level drawdown. A WSCP for developed for another community can be provided as an example. The target elevation makes good sense; however, the actual value is a direct function of the rate at which the water level actually drops in relation to the minimum water elevation at which the City of Biwabik's water supply can operate. This was specifically addressed by the ERWB and the City of Biwabik, that is why the terms of the Water Supply Contingency Agreement (WSCA) strongly and directly specified regular water level measurements be made and regular quarterly meetings be held between the City of Biwabik and the ERWB to review the data and maintain a collective understanding of where the water level appears likely to go in the next 5 years on a rolling quarterly basis. The WSCA further notes that a 1-year time period in advance of the minimum water elevation will trigger implementation of the mitigation plan to ensure the City of Biwabik will continue to receive an equivalent supply of raw water from Lake Mine. Setting an actual Target Elevation at this point is premature, but the WSCA does have the mechanisms in place to regularly monitor and address the matter, should it become a problem. If we actually have to identify a value for the Target Elevation, we can try to get a time prediction from the Barr modeling (discussed below), but this will most certainly establish a preliminary value that is less accurate than the mechanism put in place by the Terms of the WSCA.

The calculation of the drawdown caused by Aurora/White alone presented in the 10/5/2021 memo from SEH is not adequate to demonstrate the likely impacts from the proposed Aurora/White appropriation. The memo relies on GoldSim modeling which was conducted by Barr in 2014 and does not represent current conditions. Barr also constructed a MODFLOW model in 2015, which predicted drawdown as a result of combined pumping for Biwabik, Aurora/White, and Hoyt Lakes. Updated modeling which predicts expected drawdown from existing Biwabik appropriation plus the proposed Aurora/White appropriation is needed. This model could be adapted from either earlier model but should include information learned during both modeling efforts. SEH will move forward with a solicitation to Barr to have this update work completed where the current uses of the Lake along with extractions from Biwabik and the Town of White/Aurora will be modeled. It is unclear of the actual schedule for this work, but I am thinking it will be in the next 3 months or so. My assumption is that the final Water Appropriations Permit is not needed until the project is nearing completion and the need for water withdrawal is at hand. Am I correct in this assumption?

Additionally, final construction plans including a dewatering plan, and a lease agreement are still needed. On the lease agreement, I am of the understanding that those agreements were provided to you by Jodi Knaus, from the Town of White, during the January 18 meeting. If this is not correct, please let me know which agreement you are lacking and I'll have that sent to you.

On the matter of the dewatering plan, the question has been asked of me as to why this is included as part of the water appropriations permit? If the water appropriations permit is not needed until the project is constructed, then the dewatering effort will have already occurred. Would the dewatering plan be needed for a construction permit and not the water appropriations permit? Can you help me to understand this element?

Hi Erika,

The East Range Water Project is starting to ramp up again in anticipation of the State legislature passing a bonding bill this session. As such, I wanted to reach out to you to see you could share the status of the appropriation request. Last items that I was aware of were the five (5) following questions/data requests that were outstanding:

- 1. Amount of groundwater to be appropriated for constructing the caisson/water intake. Include dewatering details, such as proposed receiving water (will it be pumped directly into the Embarrass Pit?). **SEH will provide future** response sharing the dewatering specification from the Raw Water Intake documents.
- 2. Provide evidence of ownership, or control of, or a license to use, the riparian property where the water intake will be located. SEH will provide a copy of the DNR and SLC lease agreements in the future response packet.
- 3. Water Supply Contingency Plans (or other agreements) for the City of Biwabik and Giants Ridge that address potential impacts to their existing water supplies and mitigation for impacts. SEH has enclosed copies of the two (2) executed contingency plan agreements between the City of Biwabik and the East Range Water Board (ERWB) and between the IRRRB and the ERWB.
- Details regarding impacts to the existing public access, such as if the plan is to alter/close the access and inform the public of changes. The boat landing is owned/maintained by the Town of White (TOW). As such, their plan is as follows.
 - a. The TOW will hang on to the boat landing lease until such time as the boat landing cannot be safely due to lake level drop.
 - b. The TOW will have the lake bottom surveyed in the area of the boat landing to determine a lake bottom profile. From that effort, the TOW will have an analysis completed that identifies at what lave level the boat landing becomes unusable.
 - c. The TOW will regularly monitor the lake level to track changes in depth at the boat landing to watch for unsafe conditions.
 - d. In the event that the boat landing becomes unusable due to a reduction in lake level, the TOW will close the boat landing and there are no plans to relocate the boat landing at any other place on the lake.
- 5. Changes that would be needed to the system if other municipalities are added on to the same system. There will be no physical changes needed to the Raw Water Pump Station should Biwabik and/or Hoyt Lakes request service in the future. The Raw Water Pump Station and Intake have been physically sized and configured to support service to Biwabik and Hoyt Lakes.

THE NEED

- The East Range Water Board was established in July 2021 by the City & Town to CREATE a New East Range Water Supply System (called The Project)
- Over ten years of planning, engineering design, and financing The Project have gotten us here
- The Project is progressing rapidly thanks to recent funding approval
- This initial phase of The Project will combine the current City of Aurora and Town of White utility customers with the addition of utilities in Scenic Acres
- The new water source will be Lake Mine with a new water plant built next to the current Public Works facility in Aurora
- The final phase of The Project will be the addition of the City of Biwabik and the City of Hoyt Lakes in the future
- The Project is needed because of aged infrastructure, rising pit waters, and poor water quality
- Recently detailed articles were published in the East Range Times

THE PLAN

- Project infrastructure engineering and plant design was completed by Short Elliot Hendrickson Inc.
- All permitting & environmental review required is either done or in progress
- All legal work is in progress or completed for property easements and land leases by Fryberger Law
- Construction bids will be published in Spring of 2023 (date to be determined soon)
- The Project construction timeline is 2 years
- Once complete, the existing St. James Pit intake and water treatment facilities will be decommissioned

THE COST – Estimated \$24.8 million

- \$ 7.5 million paid from State grants authorized in the 2018 and 2020 State of Minnesota bonding bills
- \$ 6.5 million paid from federal appropriations ("Congressionally Designated Spending")
- \$ 1.0 million paid from Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation for Phase 1 water plant build
- \$ 150,000 paid from St. Louis County Community Development Block Grant funds
- \$ 5 million \$8 million paid from the State's Water Infrastructure Fund ("WIF")
- \$1 million paid from the Army Corps of Engineers
- \$3 million to \$5 million paid by City of Aurora & Town of White PFA Drinking Water Revolving Fund
- 80% of the costs of The Project will be paid by outside funding sources and not the utility customers

HOW DOES THIS AFFECT ME AS A TAXPAYER & UTILITY CUSTOMER?

- Water system facilities and operational costs are paid through "enterprise" funds
- Enterprise funds are not funded by real property tax revenues (levies)
- Monthly water utility service rates pay for these costs
- Monthly user rates will need to increase in the near future to pay for The Project (called affordable share)
- The current monthly rate as of January 1, 2023 is \$30.25 per month
- The NEW estimated monthly cost will be at least \$37.16 per month for users (based on estimated affordability rate)
