Club Board Meeting Minutes – August 19, 2024

Attendance:

Board: Patrick Donohue, Peter Kovich, Chris Sorensen, Larry Hulstrom, Randy LaBarge, Wayne Larson; Members: Jerry Sorensen, Don Snyder, Pat Snyder, Marti Casto

Peter called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM

OLD & NEW BUSINESS

- Patrick confirmed that John Wenskovitch has started his role as club webmaster. Patrick forwarded his contact information to Jerry to discuss domain registration and other financial matters related to the site.
- The Kennewick Grange picnic shelter has been reserved for September 15 from 10 AM to 4 PM. Patrick made the reservation for \$90 through the parks department. Members will be asked to bring a side dish or dessert. The club will work with member Mike Mineer to cater the entree with his business Smokin' Mike's Catered BBQ, which will be a mix of chicken and pulled pork. The club will provide water, plates, and utensils.
- Don and Pat Snyder have offered to donate their fluorescent lights and display collection to the club in the coming months/years, with the stipulation that it is kept together and maintained. The club gratefully accepted the donation and will work with the Snyder's to move material to a new unit at Finley Storage when the time is appropriate, possibly around the time of the next club show. We will need more volunteers to help set up the fluorescent tent and displays at the next show and moving forward.
- It was decided that we will likely need a new storage unit to hold the material, as well as alleviate other storage concerns that have been mounting, and Larry will work with Finley Storage on that.
- Pat Snyder raised the issue of safety when working with shortwave lights, especially their triple bright lights. If they are on while arranging a display, gloves, glasses, and long sleeves MUST be worn or you will get sunburned. Once the plastic guard is up, or the lights are off, it is completely safe.
- Camp Hancock Jewelry Retreat is held the week of labor day. Chris have gone in previous years and noted some clubs sponsor members or newer members to go, covering the cost of meals and the base price at around \$350-400. They suggested the club hold an annual sponsorship of a member to go, covering that price. It would not include material cost of classes (e.g., silversmithing requires participants to pay for the cost of silver used). Chris and Jerry are attending the upcoming retreat and will gather more information about what other clubs do for sponsoring a member to attend. The club will be asking volunteers to form a committee to decide on requirements and qualifications for the club sponsorship for 2025.

- There have been no responses to the requests for volunteers for the Geode Editor, Librarian, or Secretary positions. Patrick will post a request to the Facebook group.
- Show Business: April 26-27. The Fairgrounds contract has been signed for the club show for Building #2 (the same building as last year) at a similar rate as 2024. Larry has also reserved Building #16 for use on Saturday for the NFMS Mid-Year meeting. The 2025 Yakima Rock Club Show is also being held that same weekend, and there was some concern about vendors being spread thin between the two shows. Larry will start sending out contracts to vendors to make sure everyone is aware of their choices.
- The RiverFest Exhibition is set for October 5th, and the club has submitted paperwork to have a booth again this year to talk about rocks and minerals with the populace. Larry will bring a sign-up sheet to the next meeting.
- Wayne proposed the Junior Rock Club get their own large banner like the adult club has. Brief discussion on designs and possibilities ensued. The board decided the Junior Club should have input on what might go on it, including the possibility of a logo/banner design contest. Patrick will discuss with Junior club advisor Pauline.
- Marty gave a saw oil update. The 55 gallon barrel is with member James McLean and he is ready to start fielding requests. Patrick motioned to increase the price of the oil to \$15/gallon from the previous \$12/gallon due to rising costs of the oil from the vendor. Randy seconded and the motion passed. An announcement will go out or be in the geode with details, and members can start contacting James soon. Members will need to bring their own buckets/containers, and should use caution on the types used Jerry noted old milk jugs can deteriorate in the heat.
- Larry has printed a letter to formally register treasurer Debbie with Banner Bank to facilitate her working with club money. Patrick signed the letter and Larry will get it to Debbie to sign before submitting it to the bank.
- Updates to the Club Operating Procedures were discussed again. There were some minor concerns raised about verbiage and it has been tabled until the next board meeting.
- Cabbing class update: Mickee reported her income and expenditures for the cabbing class, and is tracking hours and attendance for thorough reporting to the club. She asked for guidance and the board decided it would be helpful if these were received monthly unless it becomes onerous, with a small petty cash amount to be held on site. Reimbursements would then be made on a monthly basis.
- Mickee has volunteered her space to be used for a rock bagging party to renew our supply of grab bags. The club will be asking for volunteers once a date has been decided; plan for September or October.
- Patrick will follow up with Debbie to send the *in memoriam* donation for Ralph Eichner to the NFMS scholarship fund.

Larry has started reviewing the Lifetime Membership roster and will have several candidates. These individuals will be noted in, likely, October.

• Larry facilitated an anonymous donation of a varied assortment of rocks and minerals to the Junior Club and will discuss plans for it with Pauline.

The consensus was this would be a good idea so long as we limited some materials so the collection did not become unwieldy.
- The club is still in need of officer nominations for President, Vice President, and one Director. The ballot must be finalized by the September board meeting, with elections to be held in October.
