## Pope Francis Easter homily: God Surprises



In his homily during the Easter Sunday liturgy in St Peter's Square, Pope Francis says that God surprises the women with a proclamation

which became a greeting in the early Church: "The Lord is risen!" The women had gone to anoint the Lord's body and instead found themselves standing before a surprise. When God announces something it is always a surprise because God is a God of surprises, Pope Francis said. He pointed out that it has been that way from the beginning of the story of salvation with Abraham: one surprise after another. God does not know how to make an announcement without surprising us. Surprise moves our hearts and touches us where we do not expect. Pope Francis mentioned the haste of the women and how God's surprises demand an immediate response. Peter and John ran to the tomb immediately at the surprising Easter tidings.

## World Meeting of Families Pilgrimage to Ireland



**Intention:** For Those who have Responsibility in Economic Matters. That economists may have the courage to reject any economy of exclusion and know how to open new paths.



## PROFITING FROM THIS EASTER SEASON:




There are different Resurrection accounts, whether of the "empty tomb" or of the "appearances",

which throughout this season of Easter we do well to invest our time to read over slowly then meditate upon so as to draw profit for our spiritual growth.

For instance, the resurrection accounts of the women meeting the angel at the tomb; Mary Magdalene meeting Jesus in the garden; John and Peter rushing to the tomb; Jesus appearing to the Apostles in the Upper Room, both without and with St. Thomas; Jesus on the shore; and of course, the disciples accompanying Jesus on the road to Emmaus then recognizing him in the breaking of the bread.



At the Masses during the entire Easter season the first reading is always taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The Acts is so action-packed and interesting that it lends itself to reading aloud.



The Apostles and disciples of Jesus radiate pure Easter joy... something we should emulate: Christ is risen, the gates of heaven are opened and we now may share eternal life with Him!"



## April BAA Contributions Will Be Matched



The Diocese happily informs parishes that thanks again to an anonymous donor, donations made for this month of April will be matched. The matching requirements will be similar to last year's.

For example:

Gifts made this month of April will be matched dollar for dollar provided the donation is an increase from the previous year. Thus, if a donor made a gift of \$400 in 2017 and increased the gift to \$500 in 2018, the \$100 increase is matched;

2) The donation is a new gift in 2018. Thus, if a donor did not make a gift in 2017 and gives in 2018, the 2018 gift will be matched in full.

Given the blessed largess of the anonymous diocesan benefactor, all of us do well to prayerfully consider increasing our gift in any way we can. If it's just \$25, that \$25 will be matched. Similarly, those who could not give last year are urged to consider giving this year so their gift can be doubled by the miracle of matching. Latest figures: as of Thursday April 5th, our parish is 42% of its BAA goal of \$14,376.
