
Book of the Month

Whenever you hear about a professional baseball player who decides to become a Catholic priest, this is one of those types of stories! The Book of the Month for both


A Grand Slam for God: A

Discussing the Readings with your children

In today's Gospel, the disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray. Jesus teaches them the Our Father. Let's reflect on one line at a time.

Our Father who art in heaven: Jesus tell the disciples to call God "Father", who is a loving and caring God.

hallowed be thy name: God and God's name are holy. We are to treat God's name with respect and reverence.

thy kingdom come: We are praying for God's kingdom of love, peace and justice on earth.

thy will be done: We pray that we will know and follow God's will for us.

on earth as it is in heaven: We ask God to help us work for God's kingdom on earth, rather than following our own wants.

Give us this day our daily bread: We ask God to provide us with our daily needs.

and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us: When we do something that we shouldn't do (sin), we ask for God's forgiveness. At the same time, we are called to forgive those who have sinned against us.

and lead us not into temptation: We ask God to keep us away from sin.




Knights of Columbus & The Ladies Auxiliary

please contact Father Ben to discuss any interest you may have and to begin a conversation about what this could look like for our parish!"




