#### Lunch with Young Friends

Our partner Hogares Providencia operates three residences in Querétero for boys and girls who have been removed from their family homes due to neglect or poverty. These vulnerable children now live in a supportive environment and have the opportunity to grow and develop in a healthy way.



During their recent visit, Juliet and Charles met with the staff of the

organization and enjoyed lunch with some of the younger boys, ages 10-12. They are a lively group and, at least to visitors, there are no outward signs of the troubles these kids have experienced. The boys share a large room with their beds neatly arranged in rows and seem to thrive in the care of their tíos and tías (uncles and aunts) who serve as their counselors and mentors.

Charles had the rare opportunity of joining about eight of these boys in the minivan that takes them to school. Although nearby, it's located on a busy street that makes it unsafe for them to walk there. The kids peppered Charles with questions, which he did his best to answer. We are grateful to our donors who make it possible for these children to reach their potential.





## Fresh Space for Growth

Our partner Niños y Niñas provides preschool programs and other educational assistance to more than 80 children and adolescents who come from indigenous families that have moved to Querétaro from their home communities. As Juliet and Charles approached the facilities of Niños y Niñas on their recent trip, they noticed that the outside walls had been attractively redecorated. This reaction was reinforced when they got inside and saw fresh paint on the walls. Several rooms had been remodeled, including the library (shown below), to make them a more inviting place for the kids to learn.

The professional teachers of our partner organization help the kids with their homework and also to adjust to life in a big city. We are honored that our donors have made it possible for us to pay the salary of one of the teachers who works with the kids most in need.
