- 3. Director's Report
  - a. Book Sale Report

The regular 2-day sale November 2nd and 3rd brought in \$1,635.66. This was originally scheduled for this date to coincide with the Chamber of Commerce's Fall Festival, but instead of a downtown event, they had their event at the high school which may have affected turnout for the sale.

We had a half-day sale on December 1st to coincide with the Christmas Parade. We brought in \$275, for a total of \$1,910.66 for the year.

b. Amnesty Month

We are trying a new type of amnesty program. Any overdue item that is returned by February 1<sup>st</sup> will have all fines cleared for that item. For any other items, if they are paid in January, we will cut them in half.

c. Tocker Foundation grant
We received a grant in the amount of \$6,298 for a vending machine, as part of our mission to be a
community center. With the closure of Pettit's and the removal of the soda vending machine at

the auto parts store, we have the only vending machine downtown. Any profits will go to the library.

- d. Hancher Foundation grant
  We received a grant of \$1,500 to expand our STEAM/Library of Things collection. Items include science kits, a record player, and a wide variety of items. We are cataloging about two items per week to add to the collection.
- e. TNMP Grant
  The City did not receive this grant, which included a new rug for the children's area and a wireless barcode scanner.
- f. J. Frank Dobie Library Trust Awards
  We did not receive any funding from the Trust.
