

Representative Hageman Town Hall

U.S. Representative and current U.S. Senate candidate Harriet Hageman (R) made a pit stop in the "Best Town on Earth" on Wednesday, March 11th, holding a Town Hall forum at the Upton Community Center. The event was well-attended, and she touched on topics ranging from delisting the grizzly bear from the endangered species list, to water rights, to economic development on Indian Reservations, to the current Iran conflict. Afterward, she took several questions from the audience.
