COUNTS *Census 2020*

Jewish Family Services of Silicon Valley is funded by United Way Bay Area and Silicon Valley Community Foundation to help ensure a complete headcount for the 2020 Census; and to contact hard-to-reach population groups: seniors, families with kids, and limited-English speaking refugees.

We know this is a challenging time for many - but the 2020 Census is still happening and it's imperative **you** participate. **Our government uses census data to decide how to allocate \$1.5 trillion dollars in funding.** When you respond to the census, you help your community get its fair share of that \$1.5 trillion to fund education, roads, health care, social services and housing.

If you have not responded by May 30, 2020, a Census Bureau employee will come to your residence to interview you in person.

Whom to Count

You should count everyone who is living at your address when you respond to the census. This includes any friends or family members who are living and sleeping there most of the time. If someone is staying in your home on April 1, and has no usual home elsewhere, you should count them too.

Be sure to count roommates, young children, newborns, and anyone who is renting a space in your home. This also includes citizens and noncitizens, legal permanent residents, foreign students in the U.S. on student visas, and other foreign citizens who reside in the U.S.
